# From the Editor

All publications like to be as up-to-date as possible. Some try to do it by predicting the future; perhaps one of the most famous examples was the headline of the Chicago Daily Tribune in the first edition of 3 November 1948. The editor wanted to be ahead of the imminent release of the U.S. Presidential Election results, so his banner written at midnight read **DEWEY DEFEATS TRUMAN!** The newly elected and smiling President Truman held up a copy of the paper in triumph at the error.

It is therefore difficult to write on 1 April about the most obvious headlines of our day without being totally of out date by the time you read this. The only possible forecast is that the turmoil, destruction and suffering in Ukraine and among its new refugees will take many years longer than any military or political "conclusion" to resolve. Many individuals and organisations in Cricklade are joining the evident support of the British nation to help as they can.

We can hope but not predict that Cricklade's return to normal life following the pandemic will continue. We see inside that the Library will now be open on Saturdays (morning until 1pm) and that the Museum which restarted on Saturday



mornings in April will now also open on alternate Wednesday afternoons.

Easier to predict is that there will be a total lunar eclipse in the early hours of 16 May. See page 25 for further information.

The England Women's Cricket team has reached the World Cup final, playing Australia on Sunday 3 April - what will be the result? But on page 41 we see that Women's Cricket was played in Cricklade 100 years ago.

Christian Aid envelopes will have been distributed with your copy of the Chronicle this month with the hope that your generosity can help those in need in Ukraine and in other areas of the world.

Whatever we may predict, I believe that, although I am writing on 1 April, this issue has no "April Fools" or "Fake News"!



# Christian Aid Week: 15 - 21 May 2022 PLEASE HELP US! Turning hunger into hope



The ground-breaking work of Christian Aid began in 1945, when the charity was founded by British and Irish churches to help refugees following the Second World War.

For more than 75 years, Christian Aid has provided humanitarian relief and long-term development support for poor communities worldwide, while highlighting suffering, tackling injustice and championing people's rights. Here, in Cricklade and Latton we have been involved in supporting this work throughout that time.

Sadly, this year Christian Aid has once again been called on to support refugees in Europe. Support has been given in providing food aid to Ukrainian refugees crossing the borders into Hungary and Romania. Longer term aid is being given to assist them in settling and rebuilding their lives. First Aid emergency kits (similar to those used by paramedics) for use on civilian casualties have been funded and supplied.

This is in addition to the work Christian Aid is already undertaking in supporting development projects, addressing the problems of drought and famine in many countries including Afghanistan and supporting the continued roll-out of Covid-19 vaccines.

# Focus on Wiltshire Council

This month has been taken up in three main areas.

Firstly, continuing from last month, thank you to all those that responded to last month's article; in particular residents subjected to speeding in and around the Forty and the Fiddle. I have taken up a number of your suggestions with Cricklade Town Council's Planning and Transport Committee to see if any progress can be made. As always the wheels of Wiltshire Highways are incredibly slow and will take months to assess the safety issues, but I am ever hopeful there are suitable measures that can be put in place to protect pedestrians in the area.

I make no excuse for condemning Wiltshire Council's decision to cut financial support for the Cricklade Open Door. Whilst the Cabinet Member denies that it is a withdrawal of funding for all Lunch Clubs, the proposed alternative funding precludes almost all such clubs from Wiltshire funding. The Open Door's current 65 member, three times a week meetings will be in jeopardy, pushing some of our most vulnerable residents into isolation and loneliness. Despite speaking against the funding cut proposals at Full Wiltshire Council and the Cabinet Meeting along with many other Councillors, the Cabinet have chosen to reduce the funding by fifty percent this year and down to nil in the second year. This leaves the Open Door seeking around £9,000 next year to maintain its services.

The third area of concern is the ever-increasing gravel extraction across the borders of Wiltshire and Gloucestershire. Many years ago, Central Government set aside policy for strategic mineral extraction and whilst we are forced to live with this decision, the way it impacts the lives of those living in the areas of extraction is of deep concern.

The range of concerns include::

- Water course alterations causing both flooding and drought.
- Extensive engineering and environmental disruption by noise, dust and lack of privacy.
- Lastly road safety, with larger lorries and inappropriate roads to match the increase in guarry traffic.

These are all exacerbated by being cross-border issues with neither Local Authorities wanting to take responsibility. Locally the parishes and villages are working together to co-ordinate the highlighted issues and to bring the Authorities to the table to give the communities an opportunity to seek solutions.

Some good news for two of our communities. The outline planning application has been approved to move the Latton Village Hall project forward and at a residents meeting over fifty residents turned out during the session to support the project. Hopefully, a Trust can now be established to move the project forward.

In Cricklade the Community Development Foundation (CDF) has been notified that planning consent for the Old Police Station has been approved and it can now commence work on alterations, subject to CDF still raising much needed funds. Members are eagerly sought to join the 140 members already committed to bringing the Police Station back into use within the Community. (Google Cricklade CDF for further information.)



# Lunar Eclipse!

Are you an early riser? If so, and depending on the weather, you may be able to see a lunar eclipse in Cricklade on 16 May. We can hope to see the totality of the eclipse when the entire Moon turns red.

Lunar eclipses occur when the moon is hidden from the sun by the shadow of the earth. The Moon will start to enter the Earth's shadow just after 2.30am and the full eclipse will occur just before 4.30am.

However, in Cricklade we will only be able to see the eclipse from 2.32am to 5.10am. The Moon will still be partially in the earth's shadow after that but will have set below the horizon by the end of this period.



The eclipse will be total between 4.29am and 5.06am when the Moon lies entirely in the Earth's umbra (full shadow) appearing red. The whole of the Moon will still be visible.

Saturday 14 May - Planting up the 45 planters around the Town.



# Cricklade 100 Years Ago

Football and cricket remained the most popular team games in Cricklade in the 1920s; both were part of a tradition stretching back to the nineteenth century. The Cricket Club in those days played on the vast kennel field belonging to the Vale of White Horse hunt (now Culverhay). When the hunt left Cricklade in 1934 a new pavilion and pitch were set up in a field off Gas Lane (now North Wall). Eventually this field was sold and



the Cricket Club moved to its existing site at Southam. Cricklade ladies also had their own team which played on the kennel field against Swindon firms' teams and occasionally the men.
