



Repeat Prescription Services

There are online pharmacy companies offering a repeat prescription delivery service. If you register with these companies you communicate your repeat prescription requirements to them directly. They will contact the surgery who will send the prescription to them electronically. Once they have received this your medicines will be dispensed and sent to you in the post from their central location. You should allow seven days from your request to the delivery of your medicines. This may take longer particularly over Bank Holidays. You would also need to be available to receive the parcel. Once a prescription has been dispatched from the surgery to the online pharmacy company, it cannot be re-issued in the case of late delivery.

This service could be useful for those who are not very mobile. However we would advise that the current system operated by the surgery is efficient, requires less notice and has a fast turnaround. We send your prescription electronically to your chosen local pharmacy. Even if you are unable to get out, many pharmacies offer a delivery service.

Every patient has the right to have their prescriptions dispensed at the pharmacy of their choice.

Focus on Wiltshire Council

There has been a flurry of planning applications from developers trying to build in Cricklade. Bloor Homes want to build 70 homes on Common Hill and Newland Homes want to build 140 at Stones Farm. I thought it appropriate to try and explain the complexity of the planning system with a few bullet points.

- Framework Boundary (FWB): The boundary around Cricklade within which development is permitted (agreed with Wiltshire Council and laid out in the Cricklade Neighbourhood Plan 2018).
- **Five Year Land Supply:** A Central Government figure for the number of houses to be built within Wiltshire and the amount of land needed to build them.

Wiltshire Council has for several years failed to meet the supply of land prescribed – varying from 4 to 4.7 years' supply of land. When this happens the developers can, and do, challenge the FWBs. This is exactly what happened at Hitchings, the land was outside the FWB. The developers went all the way to a Judicial Review and Wiltshire Council were forced to allow the development outside the Boundary to meet National and Local housing needs.

The land on which the current applications are being considered is outside the FWB and would not normally be considered for building. Wiltshire Council continue to fail to meet the 5-year land supply and the developers are challenging the FWB.

- **Cricklade Town Council Planning Committee** is a consultee for any planning matters. In essence its powers are limited to the same as an individual's voice to the Wiltshire Planning Authority. They have no right of veto and can only explore and comment in probably greater depth than an individual.
- **Wiltshire Council Planning** runs what is referred to as an officer devolved system where applications are submitted and determined by an allocated case officer alone.
- **Call In:** This is a privilege given to a Wiltshire Councillor, where if I (for example) do not consider the Planning Officer's intention for Refusal or Approval has taken all the relevant information into consideration, I can "Call In" the application to the Planning Committee.
- **Planning Committee** is the Committee of elected Wiltshire Councillors from across North Wiltshire who sit bi-monthly to consider applications "Called In", or those of a more complex nature. Both Call in and Committee decisions can only be based on planning law and regulations albeit with some additional local knowledge to put substance to the application.
- Other Factors: There are a number of statutory consultees to planning applications, such as Highways and Thames Water, all of whom have some input. In Cricklade, additionally because of the historic nature of the town there are Conservation considerations to ensure the uniqueness of the High Street for example. "Historic England" and "Natural England" are all national bodies with say in the future developments. The proximity of North Meadow which has protected status as an International "Site of Specific Scientific Interest" also has a great bearing on development in Cricklade. Anything likely to interfere with the water table, drainage, flooding or other relevant matters such as increased footfall by increased development

will be considered as planning matters when new applications come forward.

I hope this gives you some insight to the complex process involved.

If you are having a problem with Wiltshire Council, the Housing Association, or just need some general advice, I can normally find the right contact or highlight your problem to someone who can help. I have a direct telephone contact to all Officers in Wiltshire Council, and you will be surprised what can happen if you talk to the right person. I cannot promise to fix your problem personally, but I can assist you to resolve it.

I am also out and about in Cricklade, Latton and Marston Meysey during the week and I am always happy to meet with you if you have a specific problem to discuss. 50 Shades of Green

The Adventures of an Eco-Warrior Wannabee.

Who remembers Earth Day back in April? Did you notice? Did you post a ".gif" wishing friends a Happy Earth Day? I remember it well because I got 'proper mardy' (Yorkshire term for grumpy) and then I had an epiphany (that would be a great name for a cocktail).

I was cross at others for not acting to stop climate change but realised that although I might be making better choices and learning to live more sustainably, I'm not actually doing anything to halt the damage being done by continued large scale fossil fuel use. The latest IPCC report makes it clear that we have just five years to make substantial changes to carbon emissions – this tanker will take a lot of turning and we should have started 50 years ago.

So I made a promise to myself that I would do something to make a real difference and thanks to the brain lubricating power of Prosecco (it was a Friday night) I knew exactly what I wanted to do.

There are currently 2 planning applications in progress for new estates in Cricklade. There are Government plans in place to enhance building regulations to improve energy efficiency in new builds – first of all an uplift requiring a 30% improvement in emissions from June 2022. There is then the intention for a Future Buildings Standard to be implemented in 2025 with a requirement for buildings to be carbon neutral ready (not actually carbon neutral, but poised and waiting ready to make the change, a bit like me and my beach body diet).

However, there will be a window in that period for planning applications which are passed before the 2025 deadline to utilise the lower standard and this could include the Cricklade plans. I think this is unacceptable and that we as a community should make it clear that we will not accept any more houses that are not actively 100% carbon neutral. It makes me fume (dangerous with my blood alcohol levels) that 70 were built at Hares Chase with absolutely no mitigations and now I want to make a stand.

As you read this I will have started an open letter with collected signatures and I will visit our local MP for support and advice (we are still on civil terms luckily). I know many of you will be following these applications closely and objecting anyway but I hope you will support me in taking a stand to stop any more fossil fuel reliant houses being built in our beautiful town.

Cricklade 100 Years Ago

HOW CRICKLADE CELEBRATED A ROYAL EVENT 80 YEARS AGO

An Ox Roast marking the Coronation of the Queen's parents, King George VI and Queen Elizabeth, took place on Pauls Croft field behind the Town Hall in May 1937. First there was a special service at St. Sampson's Church, followed by a procession led by the Town Band. The day beforehand a stand to roast the ox was erected by local

business men, with galvanised sheets on one side to protect the fire, fuelled by wood and coal, from the wind. This was lit at 6am with the ox rotated on a hand-turned spit to ensure it cooked evenly. A large crowd had gathered by 11am to watch the High Bailiff sample the first slice, cut by a team of local butchers, after which an orderly queue formed each carrying a plate to receive theirs. In the afternoon there was a sports event organised on the field, teas, and a glorified fete, and in the evening a dance was held at the Town Hall from 9pm until 3am the following morning. Today, a large oil painting of the Ox Roast by Edward Buttar hangs in the Town Hall.

The Final Word ...

With the arrival of summer comes the arrival of visitors to this beautiful part of the country in which we live. For many of us that can mean longer journey times. Roads which are free of traffic in the winter are now congested with slow moving sightseers, or even worse for the motorist in a hurry, cyclists. Even the best-intentioned drivers can find themselves overcome by road rage.

"Road rage" is just a snappy name for a phenomenon which has existed long before cars were even invented: putting oneself first. I want to knock 10 minutes off my journey time so why should you get in my way. When we look honestly at our lives, trying to identify behaviour we are ashamed of and want to change, so much of what we do wrong is rooted in selfishness. We put our own wants first and so we end up being unkind to someone, or being dishonest with our employer's money, or unfaithful to our wife or husband, or whatever.

In part of his teaching, Jesus lists the requirements of those who seek to be his followers. The key character trait is the ability to put others first and yourself last. "If any want to be followers of mine, let them renounce themselves," Jesus says. Just imagine a society in which everyone acts as if they are the most important person in the world. The end result is inevitably conflict and misery. A happy society is one where people are motivated by love: to love our neighbour as ourselves as Jesus asks us to. Love can only flourish in the lives of those who consider others more important than themselves. To love your neighbour is to wish for your neighbour's good even at the expense of your own self-interest.

So many of the crises which our world faces, from wars to climate change, have their origins in human selfishness. The way towards solving these crises requires a transformation of behaviour. We need to learn to live for others rather than always for ourselves.
