

Overgrown Hedges and Bushes

Everything in the garden is growing rapidly, unfortunately not just the flowers and vegetables.

The Council is receiving many enquiries relating to hedges and bushes, where foliage is drooping or has grown over property boundaries, making footpaths and pavements difficult to walk along for everyone. Please look at your boundaries and clear the ways for others to walk without difficulty. If you have elderly neighbours, they may appreciate a hand to clear theirs.

New footpath on Fairview Fields

Thanks to a National Lottery Community Fund grant, Cricklade Town Council was able to refurbish the footpath from Hatchetts to Fairview fields and also install a new path from Stockham Close path down to the river. This makes a completely accessible path for those residents that would like access to green space but are unable to walk across the grass. It's a lovely addition for those that need it.

Protect your Open Spaces

Please help us to protect these important community areas.

We have received several complaints relating to Fairview Fields and the Millennium Wood. We would ask residents not to camp in these areas. In recent weeks, we have had to clean up waste of all descriptions!

- BBQs are now banned from use on any land belonging to Cricklade Town Council.
- If you are walking your dogs, please pick up your dog faeces and place it in one of the many bins on site or take it home with you.

Hallsfield Meadow, Fairview Fields: these, together with the Millennium and Jubilee Woods, are there for all the community to enjoy. Feel free to picnic but no BBQs please.

New Belisha Beacons

Thank you for the positive responses about the new beacons that have been installed on our four zebra crossings. The old ones were not very visible during daylight hours leading to many 'near misses' that put pedestrians at risk. Although Highways matters are a Wiltshire Council responsibility, we were able to bring pressure to bear (and cover 25% of the cost!) to bring about the upgrade.

Focus on Wiltshire Council

In July, I made a plea that if you wanted to contact me please could you make sure you leave your telephone number or contact address. Last month I had two letters without contact details, both requiring a response to the residents, so if you wrote to me, please contact me so that I can assist you.

I have received many complaints about the poor road repair in Bath Road. Despite further lobbying there seems little hope of the rest of Bath Road being repaired despite the apparent insanity of doing only half a job.

At a recent briefing as Vice Chairman of the Environment Select Committee, I was told there are over 6,000 kms of Rights of Way (RoW) across the county, plus canal towpaths and 31 Country Parks containing 400 acres of land. The County has statutory obligation to keep these all in usable condition. This department is also responsible for all trees not on the highway verges, the legal mapping of all Rights of Way and any amendments.

Wiltshire Council received over 4000 entries on the 'My Wiltshire App' last year regarding blocked or unpassable RoWs. The mapping of RoW is apparently a very skilled and time consuming task taking four full time staff engaged in the work. Such is the time taken to process the mapping that there is over 50 years of backlog and the number of amendments is increasing all the time.

Despite the legal responsibility of WC there are only two Tree Officers for the whole county, and six Rights of Way Officers (1000 km each) and a miserly budget of £1.2 million. Walking for pleasure and its health benefits are well known, yet the opportunities to explore the countryside are being curtailed. There is, however, an opportunity for local groups to volunteer to keep the ROWs open and inspected. Maybe you could lead a group to walk the footpaths in Cricklade, Latton or Marston Meysey and report back on your findings? The Parish Clerks all have maps of the footpaths. Highways Engineers have also been out in some areas inspecting, and you may get a reminder to keep hedges and boundaries on your property clear of the footpaths.

Some other Highways news: there has been an increase in funding for small highways improvements. The increased cost of materials will swallow up much of this, but we should see an increase in minor works such as drop kerbs and white line replacement. The additional funding will come from the revised Local Highways and Footway Improvement group (LHFIG). Parishes can apply for projects to be considered through the Area Board. Please bear in mind that parishes will have to contribute up to 25% of the cost and the total amount available is only around £85,000.

I am concerned that many of our elderly residents are not getting the financial assistance they are entitled to. If you are in contact with any vulnerable residents, please ensure they are aware of the grants they are entitled to from Wiltshire Council and Central Government. In particular, many of these grants are initiated online and without online access they are being denied essential funds.

If you are having a problem with Wiltshire Council, the Housing Association, or just need some general advice, I can normally find the right contact or highlight your problem to someone who can help. I have a direct telephone contact to all Officers in Wiltshire

Council, and you will be surprised what can happen if you talk to the right person. I cannot promise to fix your problem personally, but I can assist you to resolve it.

Examples of projects that have been supported are machinery for the Cricket Club, equipment for the Town Band, a gate at the Jenner Hall, the Clock at St Mary's, mirrors in the Dance Studio at the Leisure Centre. Our grants, given for capital projects not for running costs, enable groups to provide a community facility that may otherwise be lost in the future without valuable support.

It is hoped that you may like to donate now or leave a legacy in your will for the benefit of Cricklade and the future of Cricklade. Wayland Estates Charity is the perfect way to do this by adding to the Charity's capital and ensuring a healthy future income with which to help groups supporting everyone in Cricklade.

1924 Austin 7 Pramhood Chummy

In September last year, I was passed a snippet of Cricklade's history from Jim Beavis in Giles Avenue, via John Coole. Jim wrote, '... A 1924 Austin 7 is coming up for auction on 23 September [2021], which had been stored in Cricklade for 28 years before being discovered in 1966 and restored.'

I found the auction house's website and their description of it was:

"1924 Austin 7 Scoop Scuttle Pramhood Chummy – same family ownership since 1966. Reg. no. DD 4046 Chassis no. A13044 Engine no. M3087

"In 1966 DD 4046 was discovered in Cricklade, near Swindon, by well-known Austin 7 enthusiast Fred Eley. Fred secured the car from the farmer owner, [and] he then stripped the car down, cleaned and restored the paintwork where necessary, but Fred declared at the time that the car was in such good condition, with just 32,000 miles on the odometer, that it didn't take very long to make it roadworthy, with everything still in very original condition. Fred then exhibited DD 4046 at many rallies, winning numerous awards, and he even toured Holland in it in 1970. At the 1982 Austin Diamond Jubilee DD 4046 was the fifth oldest Austin 7 present ... After Fred died in 1997 'Bluebell', as she was affectionately known, was placed on loan to the Atwell Wilson Motor Museum, in the same town where Fred resided [Calne], and she has been there on display until now [2021]. [The auction house] understands that the engine was last started in 2003, so full recommissioning will be required prior to use. DD 4046 is offered with a display board of various trophies won, some award certificates, old photographs, postcards, newspaper cuttings, a V5 and a full Austin 7 tool kit also on a display board."

I followed the auction on line and not every lot sold. But this one did and it sold for £24,000 almost twice the original auctioneer's estimate of £12k-£15k.

The British Motor Museum near Coventry has just started a 100th Anniversary Exhibition for the Austin 7 which I was pleased to be able to visit in July. Their "Small Car - Big History" exhibition takes visitors on a journey "from the Austin Seven's conception in 1923 in Britain, to its reach and influence worldwide. The exhibition uses a combination of the Museum's rich collections of archive materials, artefacts and seven special vehicles."

Their Chummy is red. Our one above is blue!


