

Focus on Wiltshire Council

With the budget set for another year and increases in Council Tax across the board, life will be a little harder for all of our residents with increased costs and decreased services.

Some of the debates at Wiltshire Council committees recently have been about Central Government introducing a number of changes to legislation that will affect Wiltshire and, in particular, the cost of implementing Government policy without any extra financial support.

The Boundary Commission is reviewing the size of Parliamentary Constituencies. Not many years ago Cricklade was part of North Swindon and the changes to the size of Swindon made the area too big and we were moved to North Wilts where we are today.

Now the increased size of North Wilts and Swindon will require another change where Cricklade, Purton, Malmesbury and the surrounding villages will join Cirencester in a new South Cotswold Constituency. This is fraught with difficulty with a new MP and Constituency crossing county boundaries, but we will remain in Wiltshire as part of Wiltshire Council. The consultation has now closed so we will await the outcome.

Close to the same subject all voters will require Photo ID in all elections from October 2023. Most common IDs such as passport, driving licence, blue Badge will be accepted but I worry about some of our most vulnerable residents who may not have these. If you can help them, please go to *electoralcommission.org.uk* to see how to obtain a suitable ID document.

Another piece of legislation concerning antisocial behaviour: fly tipping and especially graffiti have been on the increase in and around Cricklade. The fixed penalty will shortly be raised to £1000 and, given the increase in graffiti in particular, please spread the word especially to some of our younger residents of the consequences of such actions.

New legislation around waste collection will lead to further segregation of household waste. There will be collection by Wiltshire Council of food waste weekly. Introduction to this service to every household in Wiltshire will be very costly and another burden on your Council Tax.

I sit on the Environmental Select Committee where all of this legislation and, in particular, its impact on residents of Wiltshire is debated. Often we have little control over the legislation sent down from Government except to negotiate the cost implications of its implementation.

There remain many concerns from Housing Association residents about poor maintenance and repairs. Central Government has a campaign at present to make residents aware of their rights and the procedure to complain in the first instance to the housing Association and if you are not satisfied, how to complain to the Ombudsman.

If you are having a problem with Wiltshire Council, the Housing Association, or just need some general advice, I can normally find the right contact or highlight your problem to someone who can help. I have a direct telephone contact to all Officers in Wiltshire Council, and you will be surprised what can happen if you talk to the right person. I cannot promise to fix your problem personally, but I can assist you to resolve it.



Cricklade 70 Years Ago

Queen Elizabeth II's Coronation.

The organisation of the local celebrations for Queen Elizabeth II's Coronation on Tuesday, June 2nd 1953, was the responsibility of Cricklade Parish* Council, with various ideas being considered in advance. One which materialised, was a fund-raising plan to lay a mile of pennies along the High Street pavement kerbs, so residents had to be careful not to dislodge them whenever they left their houses! [*The Parish Council was renamed Town Council in 1974. Ed.]

In the event the ambitious schedule consisted of:

- a united service at St. Sampson's Church,
- judging of the best decorated private house or business premises,
- bell ringing,
- a museum display of a William the Conqueror silver penny minted in Cricklade,
- children's sports at Hall Close,
- free teas for children under fifteen at the Town Hall with the presentation of souvenir mugs,
- free concert given by the boys of Prior Park School,
- dancing in the High Street to the Town Band,
- bonfire on Calcutt Forty with fireworks and a torchlight procession back to town,
- and finally a Grand Dance in the Town Hall to the 'Blue Star Orchestra'.

The following day a free tea was provided for all persons over 65 at Prior Park School. Most people's memories, however, revolve around the transmission of the event from London live on their new television sets bought specially for the occasion. Families and neighbours crowded into each other's homes to watch the tiny black and white nine-inch screens, often for the first time.

1953 Coronation memories from Enid Gassor (1908 - 1997)

Enid Gassor, whose description below of Coronation Day in London is taken from her account published in the Town Council's souvenir booklet (1952), was born in Cricklade into a well-known family of local builders, the Littles, who lived in Abingdon Court Lane. In 1953 she worked at the Post Office Exchange in Swindon and, on 29 January, a circular arrived there inviting employees to apply to a ballot for one of seven thousand seats available on uncovered stands in The Mall to watch the Coronation procession. Enid applied but was disappointed not get a ticket until, unexpectedly, an offer came of two unwanted seats. With her friend Kathleen Vickers from Cricklade Post Office happy to join her, they excitedly planned their big outing, with friends offering various advice such as, 'take smelling salts, a little drop of brandy, plenty to eat and drink, wear old shoes and take old newspapers to sit on.'

Enid recalled, "On the Coronation Eve we travelled from Swindon Town railway station to

Surbiton where friends, who had offered us a bed for the night, met us. On Coronation Day, we left at 4am for Wimbledon station. The weather forecast was poor – drizzle increasing to heavy rain here, and crowds getting denser as we approached the heart of the city. From Victoria Station we walked to St James' Park, where baskets of red geraniums each in the shape of a crown hung from stands. Finding our seats, we settled down among the crowd to eat our sandwiches, and drink our tea from a red, white and blue Thermos flask

"The scene in The Mall was of four tremendous gilded arches with the lion, the unicorn and the crown suspended from them, panels of pink and red embroidered 'E R', and ornamented pillars at frequent intervals. The whole Mall was lined with guards in their bearskins and red coats, just like a picture book! A nearby child asked, 'What is the Queen doing now, Mum?' 'Having a cup of tea.' 'Does she drink tea like her subjects, or is she in the parlour eating bread and honey?' Australians were guarding us. There were cheers for the sun, people singing 'It ain't gonna rain no more', Ikley Moor bar t'at', 'Tipperary' and Welsh airs. Then suddenly there was a great cheer. 'Everest is conquered!!'

"The procession from the palace came in stages. Queen Saloti of Tonga captivated us. With the crown prince and her daughter-in-law they rode in an open carriage heedless of the rain. She wore red feathers but no crown. The crowds were very quiet and orderly at this point, but then there were tumultuous cheers when the golden state coach carrying the soon-to-be crowned Queen appeared – a breathtaking sight! As the deafening cheers subsided after she had passed, I felt a tide of great loyalty to my nation. What must it be like in the Abbey where bishops, kings, queens, envoys and plenipotentiaries from all over the world are assembled? I wondered. 'Am I really awake, or is this a colourful dream?' We saw the Queen Mother and Princess Margaret passing, Princess Alexandra, who at sixteen will be a beautiful woman, Winston and Lady Churchill obviously enjoying the occasion to the full. We were awed by the splendour of the whole occasion, and I thought, 'Thank God for his good gift of sight. I have been very privileged to have witnessed this scene on June 2nd 1953."

Adventures of a Wannabee Eco Warrior

I was Chair at a Cricklade Climate Action Network meeting recently, in my role as Vice-Chair (of course I'm Vice, we also have a Deputy Chair to spread the load) and I'm not sure it really showed off my skillset. Apart from laughing at our lovely Secretary's typos (just rude of me really) this is how a typical conversation went:

AB: I've been collecting eggshells for some time now...

TG: Don't tell me you can make wine with them?

AB: No, I keep them in empty soup pots and...

TG: You steep them in alcohol to extract the calcium?

AB: ...and I crush them up using another pot, it's such a satisfying crunch, and then I...

TG: You use them as finings for wine or beer!?

AB: ...no, I've got quite a lot of them now...

TG: I don't see what use they are then...

AB: ...and it seems such a waste to just throw them away.

KR: You can put them round plants to keep off the slugs.

TG: I suppose it saves wasting good beer...

MB: I think you can add them to compost to add calcium...

TG: This is sounding like a gardening question to me. I'll refer you to the Bloomers on that AB.

It turns out they are really useful and can be ground up to provide a calcium supplement for your plants, or more excitingly, you can add vinegar and ethyl alcohol to create a combustible gel!

We also discussed battery recycling - Cricklade CAN (the original crew) have done a great job for 10 or so years collecting batteries from Cricklade residents, recycling above the national average. Times have moved on though, and household batteries can now be put out with our recycling bins – in a sealed bag on top on the bin lid. The battery collection buckets in various locations around town will remain for the time being, along with the low energy lightbulb (compact fluorescent lamps) box in the Town Council Office (no, I didn't know either - we do now).

Finally we talked about the need for a social media / marketing person in the group to help us connect with people. If you would be interested in joining us to help with Facebook and other communications please let us know by emailing trizagreen@icloud.com

Our next meeting will focus on planning a Library of Things for Cricklade (we're still hoping someone will come up with a better name) and I'm going to discuss what I can use all my potato peelings for – I have a good feeling about those!
