



Focus on Wiltshire Council

Potholes Potholes Potholes

The Cabinet Member for Transport reported that a record number of 3,623 pothole reports were made this January, through the MyWilts app. This compares with 924 reports in December and 677 reports in November, which illustrates the scale of the problem with over 2,500 miles of roads in Wiltshire.

Officers tell us the cause has been the hot and dry summer, a period of cold winter weather and the continuing heavy rain. Wiltshire Council and its contractors are working hard to fix the potholes on the county's highways. As well as its usual teams working to fix potholes, the Council has also tasked its 18 Parish Stewards to solely focus on mending potholes that meet the defect criteria to help get on top of the issue.

Because the weather has been so wet, in many cases the teams will patch the hole as a temporary fix, and then, later in the year, more permanent repairs will take place when weather conditions are more favourable. They recognise some deeper potholes require more urgent attention than others, so they are prioritising these in the first instance.

To fill a pothole, the Parish Stewards clear the hole of debris and then fill it with a quickdrying filler. The priority is always to fill potholes to make them safe. However in doing this, at times some temporary repairs will not be as good as resurfacing the road. Nonetheless, depending on conditions, these repairs can last many years and, importantly, the approach means that a Parish Steward can fill up to 100 each week.

Wiltshire Council has been awarded £22,924,000 from the Government's Highways

Maintenance Fund for 2023/24 to pay for a range of highways maintenance and improvement programmes including resurfacing, new road markings, replacing traffic signs and signals, and filling potholes. And now an additional £3,684,800 from the Department for Transport's (DfT's) Pothole Fund is to target pothole hotspots around the County. Unfortunately, the extra funding will not solve all of the pothole issues in the County.

The time I am spending reporting potholes is significant, answering your reports to me and messages left on my answer machine. You can help. If you see a pothole on Wiltshire's roads, you can report them using the MyWilts reporting system - either through the MyWilts smartphone app for Apple or Android devices, or online at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/mywilts It is a very easy process which will help me and get the report to Highways Officers quicker.

You can also report other things on the app such as street lights that are not working, dustbins that have not been collected or fly tipping. If you have a smart phone, please get the App and have a go.

This month I am involved in the review of the Housing allocation system and would like to hear from you on your endeavour to get on the housing allocation list.

If you are having a problem with Wiltshire Council, the Housing Association, or just need some general advice, I can normally find the right contact or highlight your problem to someone who can help. I have a direct telephone contact to all Officers in Wiltshire Council, and you will be surprised what can happen if you talk to the right person. I cannot promise to fix your problem personally, but I can assist you to resolve it.

WHY? Currently, Wayland Estates Charity gives approximately £10,000 per annum to community groups. We started in 1551! Wayland Estates Charity was originally set up in 1551 when the income was used to maintain the highways of Cricklade. In the 18th, 19th, and 20th centuries the charity funded some street lighting and helped maintain the Jubilee clock. Any surplus monies were given to the local authorities to help reduce rates. From 1976, with the approval of the Charities Commission, the income has been used to help local groups with grants for capital items.

Who are we? There is a committee of twelve Cricklade residents who, as Trustees, meet twice a year to decide the grant awards and to maintain the running of the charity.

Who do we help? Examples of projects that have been supported are machinery for the Cricket Club, equipment for the Town Band, a gate at the Jenner Hall, the Clock at St Mary's, mirrors in the Dance Studio at the Leisure Centre. Our grants, given for capital projects not for running costs, enable groups to provide a community facility that may otherwise be lost in the future without valuable support.

It is hoped that you may like to donate now or leave a legacy in your will for the benefit of Cricklade and the future of Cricklade. Wayland Estates Charity is the perfect way to do this by adding to the Charity's capital and ensuring a healthy future income with which to help groups supporting everyone in Cricklade.


Surgery IT System: The Practice is changing its clinical IT system in early June ... please look out for communication from the Surgery about it nearer the time.

- And more, with stalls and local businesses welcoming you to browse and purchase.


The Festival Committee has been working hard over the past weeks and months to organise the event, and to ensure everything runs smoothly on the day. However, there are two ways for you to help make it a success...

Cricklade in the 1950s Cricklade Fire Brigade

Under Harold Kilminster, Cricklade Fire Brigade moved from its pre-war site at No. 55 High Street to three Nissen huts on Pauls Croft field in 1951/52. A steel hosedrying tower and a siren on a mast were erected outside. One hut housed the fire tender, another the headquarters, and a third was used for storage. Their fire-



fighting equipment consisted of a Bedford 'water tender' with a Dennis pump to drive the tender's engine.

Ken Collier, who joined the brigade in 1959, remembers that they used two huts side by side; the first one was the lecture room and offices, with access through the back to the second hut. This had double doors at the front, and was where the fire engine was kept – a complete machine, no longer just a pump – but much smaller than today's fire engines.

In the winter they lit black coke stoves in both huts to keep them from freezing, as the fire engine had to be kept warm for the electricity to power it. Retained firemen were available around the clock and others only after work.

If you'd like to be part of the choir, you'd be very welcome. No experience is necessary. We'd especially love more tenors and basses!




