





## Wiltshire Council - How do you report complaints?

We are often contacted by residents who have a complaint, but many of these issues are actually the responsibity of Wiltshire Council. Wiltshire Council is responsible for a wide variety of issues including – drains and manholes, dog mess, fly-tipping, footpaths, pavements and kerbs (includes weeds), graffiti, debris on the roads, overhanging bushes and trees, pedestrian crossings, potholes, public litter bins, public rights of way, roads (includes closures and diversions), street lighting, street litter and sweeping. You can log issues direct as below, or you can also telephone 0300 456 0100.

## **HOW TO LOG AN ISSUE**

Type into your browser or Google: my.wiltshire.gov.uk or scan the QR Code. Either log in or register – then pick a "Report it" category, which opens up further options – as seen with Roads, pavements & footpath category below (example):

A map will appear, most likely centred on Trowbridge or showing all potholes reported in Wiltshire.

But there is a box in the top left corner where you can type the street name. Here we've typed "High Street, Cricklade". Press "enter" and the map will show the street location.

With your mouse (or touch pad) you can click on the precise location of the hole!



When you click on the map, a box appears saying "Report pothole here". Select whether it is in the roadway or on the footpath and add any other relevant details, and you're done!

## Focus on Wiltshire Council

The first meeting of the housing allocation review working party, on which I sit, took place at the end of June. Some of the statistics are quite shocking. The waiting list has grown from 3,500 in 2020 to 4,300 in 2023. There has also been an increase in homelessness and rough sleepers. Large numbers of those on the allocation list have no prospect of bidding successfully, not meeting the criteria. At the same time the housing stock is diminishing as the suppliers (Housing Associations) are selling off stock they consider uneconomical to renovate or repair. The larger the property a family requires the longer the wait, as there are so few large properties available.

In our area, given that an applicant meets all the conditions, they can expect to wait three and a half years for a two- or three-bed property. Currently there are only sixteen properties of all classes available. The bands for the criteria even to get onto the allocation list are so restricted.

There are four main bands. The highest for example might include Witness Protection in Band One, to Intentionally making yourself homeless (antisocial behaviour, or removal from housing for non payment of rent) in Band Three.

Royal Wootton Bassett and Cricklade area has one of the highest allocation waiting lists with 152 on the list.

The review hopes to make the process simpler and more transparent. However, no matter how the allocation process is altered the housing stock is very limited and not set to rise; the list of people requiring housing will increase.

Coincidentally Wiltshire Council is also considering its local plan which includes the housing needs for the County. This includes the five-year land supply for housing. So on one hand we identify the lack of social housing and on the other the controversial development close to, or on our green open spaces. There are developers waiting to build all around Cricklade if they can get permission.

Will this help the shortage of social housing? Probably only with limited effect as the developers see four and five bed homes as their target to maximise profit.

Staying with the topic of housing, I continue to get multiple complaints about Green Square Accord concerning property and grounds maintenance. It is not satisfactory to wait weeks for heating repairs or security of your property. Please call me if you are having unresolved problems and I will try and mediate.

If you are having a problem with Wiltshire Council, the Housing Association, or just need some general advice, I can normally find the right contact or highlight your problem to someone who can help. I have a direct telephone contact to all Officers in Wiltshire Council, and you will be surprised what can happen if you talk to the right person. I cannot promise to fix your problem personally, but I can assist you to resolve it.

Better news from our Area Board: I have been able to assist the Cricklade Football Club to secure an investment of £5,000 towards a secure storage compound for their equipment and £1,500 for the Festival Committee to purchase equipment for this year's returning Festival.

There are substantial funds available for local projects. If your Club or organisation needs funds for a capital project talk to me and I will guide you through the application process.

## Cricklade in the 1950s

## **Cricklade pantomimes**

In the summer of 1957 a flourishing Music and Drama group was formed in Cricklade, drawing many young people, adult organisers and performers together to produce plays and pantomimes.

Pam Rudman, one of many teenage participants, explains that Mrs Muriel Weston, at the Forty, was responsible for teaching the various casts choreography in the Town Hall. A number of Cricklade's male teachers took part, so rehearsals were held at the Bottom School.


The first pantomime, 'Goody Two Shoes', took place in January 1958 to packed audiences. In this production Mrs Weston, with her beautiful soprano voice, played the heroine whose brother 'Tommy' was played by John Fieldhaus, while Bob Carling, teacher Bruce Beaumont and local residents Ivan Jenkins and Ron Yeates took the other character roles.

Mrs Elsa Lloyd directed the music, teacher Alec Robson was the stage manager, and his colleague, W J 'Binnie' Cusack – who also produced school plays – was responsible for its production. Such was their success that two more pantomimes followed – Babes in the Wood (1959) and Aladdin (1960) plus a number of one-act plays in between.



## Cricklade Bowls Club

On the home front, care of the green is a constant issue. Now the wet weather is over, the lack of rain means we need to water the green most days. Watering keeps the green damp but the grass doesn't actually grow quite so much as it would in wet weather; but it still needs regular mowing and feeding.

We are looking for a solution to the waterlogging we had this spring. One of the possibilities may be the build-up of dead grass under the green, called thatch, which contributes to poor drainage. We can buy a scarifier attachment for the mower which will dig out the thatch and improve the condition of the grass itself; it may also solve the drainage problem. However we need to find one that we can afford!

Of course, none of the greens work is done without a team and we applaud our greenkeeper Neil for his year round work. He in turn is supported by those who put in the daily work of mowing, leaf clearance, swishing off worm casts, watering, etc. These include Clive, Chris, John D, Duncan, Jim, Paul F, Paul C, Roger, John H and Steve.

It's not only the green that needs attention. We have a long grassy, but sloped border between the club house building and the roadway which also has to be mowed routinely.

## The Final Word ...

Visiting shopping centres can be a trial at almost any time of year, but during the school holidays is probably the worst. I feel so sorry for parents being continually badgered by their offspring to buy this or that for them. Yet children themselves are under pressure from their classmates to have the latest toys or tech devices. From an early age children are being initiated into a scale of values based on what you own, rather than who you are. The boy with all the latest PlayStation games is seen is the role model, rather than the boy who is kindly and befriends you when you're lonely. Of course the parents themselves may already be under pressure from a different direction: trying to compete with the consumption habits of their work colleagues and their neighbours.

Much of our society in its pursuit of having ever more consumer goods has lost sight of the fundamental importance of being human. St Paul in his letters often urges people to forget about what he calls the unspiritual and instead to seek the spiritual. By spiritual Paul means what makes a person fully human, values such as kindness, self-control, patience, faithfulness, love of God and love of neighbour. By unspiritual he means all that blinds us to these values: attitudes which lead us to try to dominate others or to abuse the good things of God's creation.

Christian preachers, when they urge people to be detached from material goods, are sometimes accused of being killjoys. After all what's wrong with enjoying good wine or getting the latest state-of -the-art television or having a new conservatory built on to your house. There is nothing wrong with these or any other luxuries in themselves. It is when they come to dominate our lives, when the pursuit of luxury becomes the driving force behind all the decisions we make, that's when they become evil. Just think of the stress-related illnesses, the families which are broken apart, through people working ever longer hours or getting into debt trying to satisfy their material cravings.

Those who lead spiritual lives are not seeking to escape from the world. After all the world has been created by God and what God creates is good. To be spiritual is to live in a right relationship with the world. It is to acknowledge that creation is God's gift to us all and is therefore for us all to share. A spiritual person is one who detaches themselves from their own needs in order to support and build up the wider community where we can all enjoy and celebrate the gifts of others.
