Focus on Wiltshire Council

The traditional summer recess of Wiltshire Council saw little Committee Activity during August, although this doesn't stop the never ending briefing documents that need to be read and commented on. In particular there are a number of briefings and consultations around planning. Always controversial as no one wants new build in their location, yet we have a chronic housing shortage across the County.

You will have heard me mention the five-year land for housing supply on many occasions. This is determined by the Local Plan, a document complied by Wiltshire Council and approved by Central Government. The Local Plan is currently up for review. The current plan run was set in 2015 and has to be reviewed every five years as you can see it is only now being reviewed in 2023 and cannot be expected to be adopted for some time given the slowness of the progress. When adopted it will lay out the blueprint for Wiltshire until 2038.

This gap in adopting the new plan is giving potential developers a get-out clause to challenge the current Land Supply as Wiltshire is without a current and adopted plan. In Cricklade we have seen developers challenge the old plan as being out of date. The Developers are now in a rush to get planning approval given Wiltshire Council has not met its target of land supply for housing. Their argument is that if Wiltshire cannot supply land within the areas designated, then the developers should be allowed to

build outside the designated areas. In the case of Cricklade, developers are seeking planning permission on land outside of the town for over 300 homes altogether.

Controversially the proposed new plan considers around 50 new homes would be more likely up to the period 2038. You can perhaps see why the rush to beat the new local plan figures is so important to the developers. The proposed new Local Plan is available for viewing online at Wiltshire Council and public comments are welcome.

Alongside this are similar plans for gypsy and traveller sites and a Design Guide to development across Wiltshire supporting planning criteria and design standards for housing.

As I write this, I am hopeful the nightmare that is the road closure at Calcutt Street is over. I was on holiday when this work commenced and although out of the country, I tried to resolve the issues through emails and telephone calls to the relevant authorities. It has been one of the worst planned and executed closures I have known. Not helped by the poorest of signage and some drivers intent on breaking the law and HGVs following Satnav instead of common sense. I have requested an enquiry into the planning of the closure albeit necessary for the sewer work. Cricklade Town Council have no input into the planning or outcome of this event and should be praised for their efforts to communicate with contractors and the Highways Department at Wiltshire Council who ultimately are responsible for planning and signing the diversions.

If you are having a problem with Wiltshire Council, the Housing Association, or just need some general advice, I can normally find the right contact or highlight your problem to someone who can help. I have a direct telephone contact to all Officers in Wiltshire Council, and you will be surprised what can happen if you talk to the right person. I cannot promise to fix your problem personally, but I can assist you to resolve it.

Two Hours - To Prevent Blindness - Could You Help

Imagine not being able to watch TV, cut up your dinner or find your way around your home. A Cricklade resident needed to visit the Great Western Hospital every week for several weeks for injections in their eyes to save their sight. After each injection their sight was impaired for many hours.

How would you cope with the journey? How would you get to the GWH?

According to the hospital transport rules you are not eligible for hospital transport.

Broken Arm! You have to go to the Fracture Clinic - according to the hospital transport rules you can go on the bus. However, if your appointment is at 9am, and you have two young children and no car it becomes mission impossible.

It would mean a bus at 7am to Swindon, a change of bus to the hospital all with a pushchair, young children and a broken arm!

The Cricklade Link offered a solution to both these Cricklade residents. Our Volunteer drivers gave up just two hours to help them get to hospital.

The patients gave a donation to the Link Scheme and the drivers were reimbursed their fuel costs, and parking is free for Link Drivers.

Due to the retirement of a number of our long serving drivers, we are seeking new Link Drivers. We take requests on our answer machine and once a day the Co-ordinator matches up drivers and Link tasks.

Take another look at Diabetic Eye Screening

Did you know? People diagnosed with Type 1 or 2 Diabetes are entitled to free eye screening under the NHS to check for signs of diabetic retinopathy – a condition that if left undetected and untreated can lead to sight loss.



Poorly controlled blood sugar levels and high blood pressure can result in damage to the small veins that crisscross your eyes. These are important because they supply blood to the vital parts of the back of the eye (the retina) that help us to see. When these are damaged by uncontrolled diabetes, it can cause haemorrhages, lesions and other abnormalities that will be picked up by regular screening.

Diabetic retinopathy, the name for this damage, used to be the leading cause of sight loss in the UK, but the introduction of the NHS's national screening programme in 2003 means this is no longer the case, which is great news for people living with the condition; but early detection and intervention are crucial.

Last year 50,000 people in Wiltshire and Bath & NE Somerset were eligible for screening but only 44,000 attended their appointment.

If you're newly diagnosed, you will be enrolled automatically by your GP and sent an appointment within 3 months. We screen in 3 venues: Swindon Health Centre, Eldene Health Centre and West Swindon Health Centre (the nearest to Cricklade/Latton).

All you need to do is attend – or rearrange your appointment to a more convenient time and place. Our welcoming, experienced and dedicated team will be very happy to see you. Please get in touch if you have any concerns and we'll work with you to make your screening appointment as easy and stress-free as possible.

Purton in the First World War

In October 2018, I published a book giving the back story to the names on the Purton War Memorial. It is actually a history of the First World War including the background causes of the Great War and a month by month account of the war. It is interspersed with coverage of the war's effect on residents of Purton, a village typical of most if not all towns and communities in the United Kingdom. The stories behind the names are representative of all.

The book was serialised monthly in Purton Magazine from 2013 to 2019 with the timeline of the war years written 100 years after



the action. The period beyond the end of the war is included: many died later from wounds incurred during the war or were physically or mentally scarred for the rest of their lives. I also discuss how the Great War Treaties affected our thinking today, caused the Second World War and led to the miseries of eastern Europe and the Middle East to this day. The "War to End all Wars" wasn't that.

Other events around the world are also covered such as the "Spanish Flu" pandemic, so similar to the recent Covid-19 pandemic in its effect upon the world. Of course, Covid was an unforeseen nightmare at the time this book was written.

There are 240 pages with pictures and maps in colour, where colour photography was possible in those days. Both Wiltshire and Swindon Library Services bought copies for their collections. Although the book covers almost every campaign during the war, it was intended as a social history rather than military.





Cricklade in the 1950s

The period immediately after the Second World War was a very austere one for British people, since food rationing was as stringent as ever. Another national problem was the acute housing shortage due to the bombing of our major cities. Most people lived in far more crowded conditions than is imaginable today.

Bella Vincent, recalls; 'My husband and I were living in rooms in Cirencester at the top of a three-storey

building with no door to the bedroom, an outside toilet, eating our meals with another couple, and I was pregnant with our first child. We applied for housing to Cirencester District Council where the point system was explained. You had points if you were married, but your husband had more points if he lived in his home parish. They were building council houses in Cirencester at the time, but there was a four-year waiting list.

The housing officer told us that Wiltshire County Council was converting Nissen huts into accommodation at Blakehill airfield near Cricklade, and said we would stand a better chance of getting a council house eventually if we applied for one of these. My



husband, who was from Cricklade, did so, and in a matter of weeks we were allocated a hut there. We moved during the first week in January 1950. It was so bitterly cold on our first night that in the morning I could see a fine layer of frost on the top blanket of our bed, and the tin roof was overrun with field mice! Even so, after Cirencester it seemed like heaven just to have our own front door key.' From 'Cricklade Revealed', Part 8.
