

Focus on Wiltshire Council

Overgrown Hedges: Please can I remind you if you have a boundary hedge it is your responsibility to keep it clear of the road or footway. With autumn approaching and darker evenings, overgrown hedges are a danger to the public. If you fail to keep your hedge trimmed you can expect a letter from the local authority reminding you of your responsibility and indicating a time scale for you to cut the hedge. If Wiltshire Council have to send a reminder and there is further non-compliance you can expect Highways to cut it back and they will recover the cost of the work from you for the work.

Wiltshire Council Financial Position

Recent press articles, regarding some Local Authorities of all political persuasion struggling with their finances, are worrying. Councils are required to run a balanced budget or in the case of declaring themselves effectively bankrupt they become subject to Section 114 of the Local Government Financial Act which prompts this action. Whilst the Local Authorities cannot technically go bust, the outcome would be very serious preventing the Authority from spending on anything that is not essential, closing leisure facilities, libraries, parks etc, leaving only essential services such as waste collection and adult care.

With this background to some Local Authority failures, Wiltshire Council released its first quarter financial report for revenue and capital monitoring for the year 2023/24 at the Cabinet Meeting at the start of October declaring that it continues to manage its budgets prudently despite the continuing unpredictability of the economy and pressures faced by councils. At the end of the first quarter there is a small forecast overspend of around £0.3m which equates to less than 0.1% of the budget.

More than £26m of savings were identified to be made during 2023/24 and, at the end of the first quarter, more than £6.2m has already been achieved (around 24%) with a further £15.7m on track to be delivered (around 60%). The Council announced it will continue to monitor its finances robustly and focus on the delivery of savings. The Council has taken a long-term strategic approach to its budget, which includes effectively setting the next three years' budgets in February, and this means it is in a stronger position to respond positively to any unexpected issues. The Council has also provided an update on its monitoring of the capital budget for quarter one of the financial year.

Overall, the capital programme for the year stands at approximately £189m. It is likely the budget will change throughout the year as it's common for timeframes on major capital projects to evolve, particularly taking into consideration the scale, logistics and complexity of the work typically involved – made even more so by the unpredictable nature of inflation at this time.

Traditionally, the Council's average annual capital spend has been more than £100m per year. So far in 2023/24, more than £26m of the capital budget has been spent.

Whilst we should never be complacent it looks like Wiltshire Council is holding a stable financial position which members will be holding Cabinet to account during the remainder of the year.

If you are having a problem with Wiltshire Council, the Housing Association, or just need some general advice, I can normally find the right contact or highlight your problem to someone who can help. I have a direct telephone contact to all Officers in Wiltshire Council, and you will be surprised what can happen if you talk to the right person. I cannot promise to fix your problem personally, but I can assist you to resolve it.






Our toilets are twinned!

Did you know that 2.3 billion people across the world still don't have a proper toilet?

Without proper toilets, people get trapped in a vicious cycle - they are likely to become sick through sanitation related diseases. Illness then keeps people from working, children miss school, parents have to pay for medicines and food and become trapped into a cycle of debt. The charity "Toilet Twinning" encourages people and organisations to twin their toilets with latrines in poor communities as a way of raising funds to help these communities to have clean water and proper toilets and to learn about good hygiene.

The United Church toilets are twinned with two toilets in a village - Bechani - in Malawi. It is part of the Church's plans to become an Eco-church - a church which takes seriously the state of the environment and seeks to respond to the environmental challenges facing us all.

PS. We hope that you saw that the cross on the top of the Church was green during the month of October. We were celebrating "Creationtide" - a month of considering "green Issues" in our services. Watch out for other colour changes over the next year!





The Final Word ...

A time for remembering

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him John 3: 16-17

November is a month for remembering. The 2nd of November is All Souls Day when all around the world people in varying ways think about their loved ones who have died. Many nationalities use All Souls' Day as an opportunity to visit the graves of their loved ones, and the graveyards in Eastern Europe are covered with the tiny twinkling lights of hundreds of candles. In India, people take wreaths of bright flowers and the graveyards become places of beauty and colour, as they remember and celebrate with joy the lives of those buried there. And in the countries around the Baltic Sea, families actually take picnics to the graves, so that the deceased can be included in a family party as their relatives remember their place and their legacy within that family. In our churches we also hold services on the nearest Sunday to the date, This year we have already done so; we came together to think about those we love but see no longer and lit a candle in their memory as people do quite often when they want to remember loved ones at any time of the year.

Then on 11 November we have Remembrance Day and on a Sunday close to that we hold our Remembrance Services in our churches and at war memorials. This is a time for remembering the sacrifice of many throughout the ages, in many different conflicts, who have given their lives so that we might live in peace. Those known to us by name and those whose names we will never know.

I am thankful God has made us with the capacity to remember. When we think of good times, funny times, experiences and even bad times we celebrate the lives of those we love.

And in our churches each time we celebrate Holy Communion we remember that God gave his Son, Jesus, to die in love for each one of us and offer us forgiveness and eternal life. What better way to remember God's love for us.
