

We felt it appropriate to include here his final entry for his "Focus on Wiltshire Council" series. It marks the measure of the many roles he played within the Council and as your Councillor. There are many other organisations in Cricklade that will have been created, assisted and promoted through his ceaseless work.

We hope to be able to publish a fuller obituary in a future issue.

We send our love and best wishes to Tina and family at this time.

#### Focus on Wiltshire Council

Given the reasonably long break for the Christmas period and the lack of formal business meetings at Wiltshire Council, I thought you may like to have some insight into the other responsibilities that I have as a Wiltshire Unitary Councillor. Whilst, always, my first call is to the residents of Cricklade, Latton and Marston Meysey, like almost all Councillors there are many other calls on our time.

I am Vice Chairman of the Environmental Select Committee (ESC) (12 members) which meets every second month. Any meeting which may concern finance is subject to the 1974 Local Government Act which means there has to be face to face meetings. The meeting lasts round 2-3 hours and the range of subjects is vast: the Committee is responsible for reviewing the work of the Departments for Transport, Environment & Leisure, Economic Development, Planning & Housing, Waste and Climate Issues. The preparation for the meeting includes briefs on any topic in advance, often taking in many topics over several meetings. Thankfully briefings can be online since Covid. ESC calls political representatives from all parties and Officers from the Departments to explain their actions. As the Vice Chairman, I am automatically a member of the Overview & Scrutiny Committee where the Chairmen and Vice Chairs from the other Select Committees (Environment, Children's, Health) meet every 2 months to review and scrutinise Cabinet.

One of the more enjoyable roles is as the Wiltshire Council representative on Swindon Council for the Plas Pencelli Education Activity Centre, a location many Wiltshire children visit each year for outdoor activities. The Management Committee visits the centre in Wales and holds regular meetings at Swindon Council offices.

My other main commitment is as the Vice Chairman of the Dorset & Wiltshire Fire Authority (DWFRA). The Authority is the body that administers the Fire and Rescue Authority's statutory core functions, as laid down in the Fire and Rescue Services Act 2004,

They are to: promote fire safety in its area, extinguish fires and protect life and property from fire, deal with road traffic accidents and the rescue of trapped persons and deal with other types of emergencies as designated by order from the Secretary of State.

Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority (the Authority) has a statutory duty to provide the financial and other resources necessary to ensure an efficient and effective service. To this end, the Members set an annual budget after considering professional advice on the level of resources required. In addition to overseeing the Service's finances, the Authority The Chronicle

considers any new policy initiatives; these are often required or suggested by national government but can be of a more local nature. Members also have a legal duty to monitor the operational performance of the Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service and consider best practice, and this is done through workstreams and committees, as well as the full Fire and Rescue Authority. The Authority and DW Fire Headquarters are in Salisbury, a journey I make regularly. The Authority is geographically and politically huge from Cricklade in the North to Bournemouth and Weymouth in the South and taking in the authorities of Swindon, Wiltshire, Dorset, Bournemouth and Christchurch.

I remain committed to the local community.

# Churches Together: Lent Talks

From politics, sport, entertainment, academia etc... plus God.

We hear from prominent people, each with a very different and challenging story. They talk openly and honestly about their life, work and faith and how it impacts their lives.



Danny Kreuger MP: Friday 16 February at 7pm

Danny is the MP for the Devizes constituency, and is a member of his local church. He has worked in journalism and in politics, most recently as Political Secretary to Prime Minister, Boris Johnson. But his main career has been spent working in the community. In 2006, with his wife Emma they founded Only Connect, a project working in prisons to stop criminals re-offending, which he ran for 10 years and now chairs. He also set up and ran the West London Zone for Children and

Young People, coordinating the work of schools, councils and charities with young people at risk.

Tony Jarrett: Saturday 24 February at 7pm

Tony Jarrett is a former Olympic hurdler who obtained many medals during his twenty-year career, including the 4x100 relay silver medal with fellow athletes Linford Christie, John Regis, and Colin Jackson and a Gold medal at the 1998 Commonwealth Games in Kuala Lumpur.

He came 4th in the 110m hurdles at the 1992 summer Olympics in Barcelona, narrowly missing out on a bronze medal by 1000th of a second to Jack Pierce of the USA.

Tony made several media appearances including *BBC Breakfast* and coaching Ant and Dec for their *Saturday Night Takeaway* show. Although he had already won 12 medals during his career, the gold medal had always eluded him. It

wasn't until he became a Christian that he finally won his first gold at senior level. In spite of Tony's success on the track he often felt that something was missing in his life. When he accepted Christ, this void was filled. Tony enjoys sharing his testimony with an emphasis on seeking the things of God, as opposed to what the world has to offer.



Professor Andrew Briggs: Friday 1 March at 7pm

Professor Andrew Briggs is the inaugural holder of the Chair of Nanomaterials at the University of Oxford. His research interests focus on materials and techniques for quantum technologies and their incorporation into practical devices. Current hot topics include vibrational states of nanotubes and charge transport through single molecules in graphene nanogaps, and machine learning for measuring and tuning quantum devices.

He has more than 650 publications, with over 28,000 citations. He is the author of Page 20 The Chronicle several books: Human Flourishing: Scientific insight and spiritual wisdom in uncertain times (2023 ISSR book prize winner.) It Keeps Me Seeking: The Invitation from Science, Philosophy & Religion. And the Curiosity Science Quest series.



JB Gill: Sat 9 March at 7.00pm

JB rose to fame as a member of one of the UK's biggest boybands – JLS. They dominated the charts for five years, boasting 5 number 1 singles, over 10 million record sales worldwide and a multitude of awards. JLS reformed in 2020 and in the autumn of 2021 had a sell-out UK tour, as well as releasing a new single and album. Six years ago, JB set up a farm in the Kent countryside, where he lives with his wife, Chloe, four-year-old son, Ace and 9-month-old

daughter, Chiara. He is the lead presenter on CBeebies' BAFTA-nominated television series, *Down On The Farm* (created for children aged 0-6 years, teaching them about life on the farm and in the outdoors). JB's enthusiasm for farming life and knowledge of countryside issues has seen him regularly contribute to BBC's *Countryfile* and *Springwatch*.

He is also an ambassador for Mercy Ships, a faith-based international development organisation that deploys hospital ships delivering vital, free healthcare to those in need around the world.

JB performed with his wife, Chloe on the ITV Primetime show *Dance, Dance, Dance,* for which they won 'Best Performance' at the National Reality TV Awards 2017. Most recently, JB has presented on *Springtime On The Farm* and *Big Week At The Zoo* both for Channel 5. JB also presents BBC South East's *River Walks: The Stour*, in which he walked 50 miles from the river Stour's origins in the Kent Downs, to Pegwell Bay. As well as his continued work as a presenter for Down *On The Farm* and BBC *Songs Of Praise*, he presented four episodes of a BBC1 series *Walks Of Life* each an hour long, broadcast from March 2019. An avid sports fan, JB enjoys taking part in outdoor pursuits. He is a keen skier and snowboarder and is an advanced PADI scuba-diver. In his spare time, JB likes to relax with his family and plays an active role as a member of his local church.

JB has served as an ambassador for The British Red Cross, to raise awareness of the effects of climate change in some of the poorest regions in Zimbabwe.

# cricklade Bloom

Whispers from the Walled Garden

As we think about the year ahead, sustainability and biodiversity are always at the forefront of Bloomers' decision making when planning activities to help make Cricklade an attractive place for you to live. For our flower planters and baskets, our most visible activity, we only use peat-free compost and recycle as many plants as possible from season to season.

We are increasingly using permanent planting in our planters and borders, especially plants that are summer drought tolerant and insect friendly. Perennials from the large borders are divided and replanted. Pots from any plants we do buy are reused for your purchases from the cart outside the Walled Garden. We harvest rain water in large tanks. We recycle all plant waste to make our own compost which is then given away free to Cricklade residents.

Our fundraising activities (our main source of income) are as sustainable as possible, for example, wreath making workshops use only locally sourced greenery.

Bloomers is based at The Walled Garden, which is at the rear of Tesco's on the path to Green Gables Surgery. We work all year round and have three large projects this winter that are particularly good for sustainability: planting an understorey in the Millenium Wood to provide cover for birds, small mammals and insects; planting an orchard at Fairview Fields to provide local organic fruit and community activities; and snowdrop planting, an essential winter food source for insects.

The first two are weather and flooding dependent so look out for dates on our Facebook page to get involved, however **snowdrop planting** is scheduled for Wednesday, 14 February during the school half term – an ideal family event. We welcome new members on our usual mornings of Wednesday and Saturday and occasional volunteers for the large planting projects.

That love is not just for Lent, neither is it only for those who profess their love for him. That love is for all people – it is unconditional, forgiving and free.

So when the hearts appear in the shops – think of that love.
