Wiltshire Perspective

Firstly, I know this isn't how it's supposed to work, but can I ask for some help please? I'm sure there must be some photos of the Thames flowing freely as I remember it used to many years ago. Currently, I suspect its flow rate is a small fraction of what it used to be, and I'd like to put some pressure on the Environment Agency to maintain the Site of Special Scientific Interest in the correct manner. So any photos of the river around this time of year from previous years would be greatly appreciated. If you can provide a location so I can show a then-and-now comparison, that would be even better.

Secondly, Wiltshire Council have drawn up a policy for the accommodation of gypsy and travelling communities. This will be going to public consultation in the near future, and I've asked for a link to the location where feedback can be given, but I've not received a response. As a substitute, I've asked that the link be placed on the websites of both Cricklade and Latton Councils as well as their respective Facebook pages when available. It should be live by the time of distribution (fingers crossed).

On the matter of GreenSquareAccord, they appear to prioritise some maintenance jobs and others they simply can't seem to get round to. For example the two metre hole in the Parsonage Farm Close garage next to the Malmesbury Road has been there for around three years – compare that with the speed with which they put up signs in the car park in Heberden House (which has been included in my discussions with their chief executive). Having said that, parking is a problem, but not as serious as people feeling threatened with eviction, which is my primary focus with them, and with which I am pleased to say I'm making progress.

A number of people have been pointing out to me that verges and other areas are not being cut back or maintained as they used to be, which is obviously a seasonal problem, but a first for me. It came as a surprise that in all of Wiltshire, there's only a single full-time person maintaining all of the trees, in one of England's largest counties. However that person will be visiting Cricklade in September to remove a goat willow that's damaging a neighbouring property.

I have also been chasing within County Hall a number of road maintenance issues, to try and get the work progressed before bad weather starts to cause delays once the days start shortening in the near future.

Can I also apologise if I'm not getting back to you as quickly as you would like. I do try to respond as fast as possible, but please feel free to chase me if I'm being distracted by my other day job.

The Story of Blakehill Camp - part 2

From 1947 or early 1948 a new community of over 500 people sprang up following the conversion of the ex-RAF huts at Blakehill - all from different areas and backgrounds. After the misery of living in primitive accommodation, their new private facilities seemed like heaven! Five of six sites were used. Site 1 on the north side of Chelworth Road opposite a row of cottages, Site 3, behind Chelworth House reached via a concrete driveway from the Chelworth road, Site 4 on the south west side of the



Chelworth to Ashton Keynes crossroads, Site 5 on the south side of the Malmesbury road at Common Hill, and Site 6 on the north side of Common Hill.

Soon local business and tradesmen were delivering their goods and services by van



directly to all five sites regularly – not only essential food but services including television aerials for rented sets. With no telephones, telegrams were frequently delivered, and a doctor's appointment meant using the only phone box on the Malmesbury road before 10am!

In 1949 Monty, a grocer from Cricklade, established another shop at Site 5 in a former RAF Guardhouse. With its added Post Office facilities, tenants could now manage their finances close at hand. Bert Giles' coaches from Bath Road, Cricklade, ran Blakehill workers to Swindon companies as well as school runs, an hourly service bus ran between Swindon and Cirencester along the

Malmesbury road, and ditto a special workmen's train every morning and evening.

Soon, under the official title of 'Blakehill Community Centre', the residents formed their own licensed social club on Site 6 for members only, including Leigh and Chelworth. A Sunday school and babies' clinic, football and darts teams, even children's film shows soon followed, and Camp councillors were appointed to officially represent the residents. A new Junior school was eventually established at Blakehill by converting two adjacent huts on Site, and in 1948 the Blakehill Community Committee appointed a temporary headmistress before Mr and Mrs John Horlock were found accommodation on site.

By 1956 the closure of Blakehill camp was imminent – and the last in this series will concentrate on the re-housing of its many residents to new council estates at Cricklade and elsewhere.

Whispers from the Walled Garden

We are delighted that our first wild flower bed has produced an appreciated gold and blue vista at the turning circle. This month (September) we will be scything and clearing the wild flower annuals to plant fritillary bulbs and native crocus. Bulbs in a wild flower area must

be fine leaved and early flowering so their dying leaves do not cover the sprouting wild flower seed mix later in the spring.

Today, the last day of July, it is 30 degrees centigrade and a third day of above average temperatures. My garden might be wilting and turning brown due to empty water butts; however, Bloomer's water butts are not empty as approximately 8,000 litres of rain water are saved every year from our own hut roofs and one of the adjacent Tesco roofs.

Additionally, we make around 6 cubic metres of compost a year that we use to condition the flower and shrub beds around the town as well as providing free compost to Cricklade residents. For the planters and the Town Council lamp post baskets we do have to buy in compost but this is peat free and made locally. Currently, we have over 100 polyanthus and a multitude of ivies saved from last year's winter baskets to be used again this coming winter.

Sometimes extensive renovations on our facilities are required. This summer it has been the PVC roof of our 20 square metre covered area. We are replacing it with ultra violet light resistant polyvinyl which will have a longer life. The old PVC will go into the hard plastic recycling at Purton. We look forward to staying dry as we work once the autumn rains arrive.
