
From the Editor



Remembrance Services

On Monday 11 November at 11am there will be a short closure of the area around the War Memorial to enable the local schools to attend a brief service of remembrance.

The Remembrance Sunday Parade on 10 November will muster at Waylands and march down the High Street to the War Memorial, where the Act of Remembrance and a short service will take place. The parade will then march back up the High Street, to St Sampson's Church via Bath Road.

The Council apologises for any inconvenience these events may cause residents, but at no time will it delay emergency services.

Volunteers are needed to help with the road closure barriers for both events,. Please contact the Council if you can assist.

Parking in Cricklade

This appears to be a constant bugbear. Can we please remind everyone that the disabled parking spaces are provided for those with blue badges, which should be shown along with the clock to ensure that they are being used correctly. We have had a steady stream of photographs of culprit cars taken by residents, which if persistent will be reported to the police.

If you have a vehicle in your street, which does not appear to move, please check whether it is taxed or MOT'd with the DVLA online service before reporting it to us, if you can. It is not illegal to park a car on the road if it is taxed, MOT'd and insured, as long as there are no yellow lines or a solid white line and it does not obstruct a driveway.

Lastly, although we have been able to use the carpark outside Heberden House, it has now been established that Green Square do own the land, and as such have the right to disallow non-residents the use of their parking facility. We do however have two car parks on the High Street, as well as in the High Street itself, all of which are *FREE*.

A New Councillor

We are delighted to announce that Alan Poole has been co-opted as a new councillor. We look forward to working with Alan for the benefit of the residents of Cricklade.

A new Member of Parliament

At the General Election on 4 July, Roz Savage was elected as MP for our new South Cotswolds constituency. We took the early opportunity to invite Roz to a meeting with councillors in August. We heard from her about the rapid learning curve that she is on as a new MP, and we took the opportunity of sharing with her the details of issues that are of particular concern to residents.

Council Annual Report and Accounts

The accounts have now been signed off and a copy is available to read on our website or on paper copy in the front office. The accounts show that the council is in a sound financial position. If you have any questions regarding the finances please feel free to raise them with us.

Safety at Halloween

Wiltshire Perspective

Many thanks for your responses of help to evidence the flow of the river Thames in the past, allowing me to compare it with the current flows and views. I look forward to gathering further evidence and starting to raise the priority of this issue. When I have further news I'll give you an update.

During August, I'm happy to say that our local law enforcement people were thankfully largely unaffected by the recent riots, but they are already very busy. One focus point is local drugs. According to a briefing by Wiltshire Police, this permeates many different areas of rural life, not just anti-social behaviour, but sometimes far more devastating including child exploitation practices with county lines and homeowners being cuckooed. A great deal of the language may appear innocuous, but the impacts aren't.

The best way of spotting changes early on is by keeping in touch with your friends and neighbours on a regular basis. This is always a good thing to do generally and especially as evenings draw in and temperatures start to drop. You might just be able to help stop things spiralling out of control.

Whilst many in County Hall have been on holiday, some in business, especially the self-employed, are having to additionally make up for the loss in income whilst away. Wiltshire Council can help by pointing businesses of differing sizes to relevant support organisations. Just search for 'Wiltshire Council business support directory' for help.

Many of the other Area Boards in Wiltshire have specific business forums to help coordinate efforts and I know my predecessor, Bob Jones, worked hard to try to build a Chamber of Commerce. However, I understand that small businesses have little spare capacity to take on extra tasks, especially on a speculative basis.

Having said that, if there is any appetite in our parishes to reboot such initiatives, I'm more than willing to help do some of the tasks if it means we can help our local economic communities to thrive. Each of us can help as well, by thinking firstly if there's a local shop we could do business with rather than go straight to our screens and order something online or by shopping elsewhere.

Lastly, as you may know, Cricklade is updating its neighbourhood plan, primarily by digesting the great feedback you gave, both in terms of quality and quantity. So I'd like to thank everyone who chipped in. Every comment has been read and it's the Town Council's job to reflect that back to Wiltshire Council and I want to make sure what is said is paid attention to. Some of those ambitions are going to be hard to achieve, but that's a good enough reason to try, since failure would result in the same outcome as not trying, and not trying is the only way of guaranteeing failure.

The Story of Blakehill Camp - part 3

After RAF Blakehill Farm closed in November 1946 it was used as a satellite airfield by the Flying Training School at South Cerney as a relief landing ground, and when this moved to RAF Little Rissington in 1957, flying at Blakehill Farm ceased altogether. By 1956 therefore the closure of Blakehill Camp was imminent. The building of 160 council houses in Cricklade at Culverhay from 1953 onwards, together with numerous others in Swindon and elsewhere were eagerly awaited by the residents of Blakehill Camp. As early as 1951, due to numerous complaints from the residents about lighting, condensation and dampness, the local authorities realised that these ex-RAF temporary Nissen huts were totally inadequate for housing civilian families long term. Fortunately, the tenants all knew that council housing was being built in the area, placing people where possible near their work. A point system was implemented, with those with children receiving the most, and so by January 1954 the numbers on the sites had been reduced from around two hundred families to only eighty-four.

Eighteen months later just twenty families remained. The memories of the last residents to leave Blakehill in 1955, surrounded by stray cats and empty huts, evokes an atmosphere of desolation where a vibrant community had so recently existed.

Not all farmland that had been requisitioned by the Air Ministry to build the airfield in 1943 was offered back to the original farmers, but when Blakehill School closed, the land on Site 1 was cleared and returned to Cowleaze Farm. The Junior School then became a store for farm machinery, and the Infants' building a chicken house – a sad end! By July 1956 all the Blakehill tenants had been re-housed and the council had sold the huts, with tenders only invited for heaps of rubble. Finally the Rural District Council then sold off some of the Sadia water heaters and Belling cookers they'd originally installed at a welcome discount to Cricklade residents...

In 1963 the Ministry of Defence transferred the airfield to GCHQ Cheltenham, who erected the tallest wooden pylon of its kind in the country in the middle, and it remained there until 1997.

Today, Blakehill airfield is a nature reserve run by Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, and open to visitors, but no trace whatsoever remains of the lively civilian camp sites surrounding it but which are still remembered so nostalgically by the generation that lived there.

White Swan reopens after 200 Years!

A new Cricklade business that opened to the public on Saturday 24 August has paid tribute to its historic past. White Swan Beauty, named after the original 18th century White Swan inn, is a beauty therapy business offering an array of treatments.

The building at 31 High Street (next to The Vale Hotel) was known as The White Swan and is recorded to have been open in 1726. In the late 18th century its premises included a malthouse, a coach house, and a stable; it may have closed down in that form before the mid 19th century. [source: British History OnLine, Cricklade Borough, Ed.]

Since then, the building has seen many changes, including being a meeting place for political activists, a Sue Ryder shop, Cricklade Autoparts, Madam Blunt furnishings and a hairdresser, yet it retains many original features.

I am so excited to offer beauty services to people in and around Cricklade and, of course, recognise the historic importance of a lovely building right in the centre of this bustling Wiltshire town."

The Cricklade (defibrillator) Community Project

The response to a request for volunteers to ensure the Cricklade defibrillators continue to be checked, ready for action, was heartening. It means that we now have a team of Cricklade people who will share this task, and we hope to allocate one defibrillator to each volunteer, enabling me to continue for the time being as co-ordinator.

The annual support package for each defibrillator costs between £155 and £185 because batteries and pads go out of date. So keeping seven community defibrillators up and running does involve funding, and I have spoken to some very helpful people about possible grants, with one application having gone in locally already.

In addition, and because the need for funds is quite pressing, I would ask: Please can you consider making a donation to help keep the defibrillators stocked, checked and always ready to help save a life. If so, you can do this on-line via the Community Heartbeat Trust web-site:

and search 'Donate', ensuring the donation goes to 'The Cricklade Community Project' Thank you so much to everyone who stepped forward, and to those who support this important project.

Our thanks also go to Cricklade Town Council. They have awarded a £500 grant towards the on-going cost of maintaining the defibrillators in our town. This is a great encouragement to the new team who are now helping to maintain the seven units across Cricklade.




