

# Wiltshire Perspective

Sometimes I just enjoy going off-piste; it could be going down the lane I've never gone down before, or trying out a new activity. A few weeks ago, I went to the meeting of a neighbouring Area Board, in Ashton Keynes village hall, just to see how others manage their meetings and perhaps to learn a thing or two.

As the start time neared, it became clear that this was not their standard Area Board meeting. The room was packed, and everyone only had one thing on their mind and that was, as some people may have heard, the proposed gravel extraction near Ashton Keynes. The fury and passion that was expressed from all corners of the room was exceptional. Fortuitously I believe I noticed that it may well impact North Meadow and that the Ecological Impact Assessment looked to be flawed, or running on assumptions that I'm not sure are valid. I'll keep you updated with any further developments.

I know that so far nothing sounds very 'Wiltshire', but the underlying cause of the problem was the abnormal way in which the application weaved its way through the planning process. Planning is a contentious and technical subject, for any of a number of reasons, and one I'm still learning. If required, I'm happy to represent views provided to me to either the town or the Northern Area Wiltshire Planning Board.

Some developments can bypass planning and improve houses at the same time. To make things even better you can, in some circumstances, even claim a grant to do that. It's called the Home Upgrade Grant (*Wiltshire.gov.uk/hug* or 0800 098 7950).

On a number of issues I've been having to chase people in County Hall, which I'm more than happy to do as it's probably the easiest part of my job. Having said that, some items I have let slip through the net and I'm grateful for the chasers, so please do get back to me if this is the case. Sometimes it's just on a list and it takes a long time to get to the top, but in other cases I've been promised that it will be dealt with and then they go nowhere.

As this article goes out, the poppy appeal will be in full swing, remembering the sacrifices that millions of people gave for us to have our freedoms. There are many places in the world where that fight continues, with communications always improving, the horrors grow ever more appalling. Perhaps in what often appears a more polarised world, we should try to be more understanding and empathetic. In any event, regardless of the politics you hold, I might suggest taking advantage of the freedoms they fought for. If you want to have your voice heard you could register to vote at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/register-to-vote">www.gov.uk/register-to-vote</a>.

# Bonfire Night at Blakehill

In 1947 one newcomer to Site 6 of Blakehill Camp was Trevor Startup aged four who recalls the following event c.1949.

"Dad's mate, Bert – ex-RAF Blakehill – would probably have been known as a 'spiv' during wartime rationing, and seemed capable of acquiring anything you could possibly want from undisclosed sources, though no one ever questioned this. He seemed to



have contacts everywhere – he was like a mobile shop that never issued receipts!

"One November we kids managed to build a big bonfire in the square of Site 6 in front of the Community Hall for bonfire night. Dad and Bert once again colluded in providing the firework display. They'd been scheming for weeks and I knew the words, 'magnesium', 'flare powder', 'gun powder' and 'iron filings' somehow came into the equation. We all waited patiently in great anticipation for the event to begin, and were not disappointed when Dad and Bert, both now in their element centre stage, put on a wonderful show. Various ingenious devices caused flares all around the wall, flashes that blinded us and explosions which deafened us – all received open-mouthed and followed by rapturous applause! It was only when Dad's jacket caught fire with smoke pouring from it, that things appeared, even to us, to be going too far! He managed to wrench it off and throw it to the ground where it exploded in a blinding light, bringing the display to an abrupt end. He'd only been carrying the ingredients of magnesium and night flare powder in his pocket, and was lucky to escape with only minor burns!"






