How to use a Defibrillator - Easy Step Guide

You shouldn't be afraid to use a defibrillator machine. If you think someone just *might* have suffered a heart attack then follow this simple guide provided by The Community Heartbeat Trust.



- 1. Call 999 when you are with the patient, **do not go** to the nearest defib until you are told.
- 2. Answer the guestions from the Ambulance Service.
- 3. The Ambulance Service will give you the location of the nearest defib and the code to unlock the cabinet if a defib is required.
- 4. Start CPR. Instructions will be given to you by the Ambulance Service.
- **5. Do not leave the patient** unless told to do so. Wait for help to arrive; this could be a passer by or Paramedics.
- 6. If/when help arrives, somebody can then go and get the defib machine.
- 7. Carry on with CPR.
- 8. When the defib arrives, switch on and follow the voice and on screen instructions.
- 9. After Paramedics have taken control, return the defib to its cabinet and make sure the door is shut properly.
- 10. Remember **you cannot do any harm** to the patient with a defibrillator. It will only administer a shock to the patient if it is required.

Wiltshire Perspective

This month I have three big messages:

Winter Fuel Payments Planning Thames Water

Winter Fuel Payments: Contrary to many media headlines the Winter Fuel payment has not been axed! However, it will become means tested, and the Government are aware that a lot of people that could get Pension Credit don't claim it. I suspect successive Governments have relied on that fact.

Pension Credit is something anyone might be entitled to and you can think of it as a gateway benefit. If you get Pension Credit you can get many other benefits, from TV licence and Council Tax reduction to Housing benefit. If you are due those benefits, you need to check and **claim before 21 December 2024**. Give yourself a Christmas Present! Check if you're owed the money at www.gov.uk/pension-credit/eligibility. If you want help to go through the details please ask.

Planning: It appears that Wiltshire Council has changed its planning policy; from Lime Down's solar farm, Ashton Keynes' gravel extraction, to our very own North Meadow. Wiltshire Council appears to be unable to hear, or defend, the opinions of local people, or its previous refusals. To the extent that some of their own party are saying the planning function is not fit for purpose.

This is not a political column, and planning should be an unbiased implementation of policies. But I find myself fighting against the viewpoints of Council officers that I find hard to empathise with, especially in the light of their responses to questions we need answers to, or at least to be heard.

Can I thank residents who have dug into the details of the Stones Farm development and helped me fight Wiltshire Council to help them see our point of view? We will be travelling down to Chippenham to put our case as forcefully as we can to the Planning Inspector in Chippenham on 3 December.

Thames Water: When a resident sent a video of sewage coming up through a gutter in Cricklade, things had already gone way too far.

Wiltshire Council appears to be unable to force compliance, so I have escalated the issue to our MP, who has brought together a group of legislators to take a multi-layered approach and to push at every level.

I am grateful that you are pointing out to me where things go wrong. Be assured I am listening. I am even more grateful that, when I escalate things, I in turn am listened to and that there is a growing movement that sees the system as it stands is broken. Added to this is a momentum to make things better. In the short term we need to get things sorted as soon as possible.

Many thanks again for all the help you give me to fight our collective corner of Wiltshire. It's a privilege to try to help people, and if you think I could be helping you, please do get in touch and I'll see what I can do.

Ed: Thank you David for pointing this out. We have been wondering for some time about the validity of the map and list of addresses. They are only those placed and maintained by the Heart Beat Trust volunteers. However there are many more located around the town and district.

The way defibrillators work is that those attending the patient need to ring 999. They will be talked through the entire process including where to go to find the nearest defibrillator which may not be on our list. Once obtained, the machine is programmed to tell you what to do next. (See our amended page 2.)

Whilst we are closed over Christmas, the mobile telephone will still be switched on so, if you need information etc, do still get in contact - 07599 987 851.




Cricklade Bowls Club
