

Wiltshire Perspective

On 9 January, Wiltshire Council held an extraordinary meeting to look at the Government's devolution plans. As I write it's not clear either what the agenda is or what the most likely outcome is, hopefully I can give an update in the next issue.

My current understanding of the proposal is for Wiltshire, Somerset and Dorset to have a new Heart of Wessex Mayor. There are many things I'm not sure about this, including scope, purpose, outputs and perhaps most importantly budget to achieve those outputs and where that's going to come from. Another layer of administration for its own sake is perhaps the worst option, but I've got an open mind until more information is available.

One implication may be that if we reorganise the council then it would mean the elections currently planned for 1 May could be delayed, but currently a delay has been ruled out.

The second impact that central Government is having on Wiltshire is planning. Their stated intention is to build 1.5 million new homes in England. In the words of one of my favourite podcasts (BBC's *More or Less*) 'Is that a big number?' Of itself, yes, but that's over a five-year parliament, so that's 300,000 every year. The latest annual figures showed 234,500 new homes built, and almost 1.2m new homes over the last five years. Meaning around a 27% increase in new homes nationally.

This doesn't take into account that, according to the Local Government Association, there are already one million homes in England with planning permission that have yet to be started.

Some development is sorely needed, for example, in Latton, where I, with residents, argued for six new houses, which would include a new village hall and tennis courts for the community.

And in Cricklade, I hear on the doorsteps that building a few more houses in order to get commercial traffic off the High Street is a price many residents would welcome.

The upshot is that Wiltshire Council's current approach to planning isn't very sympathetic to many of the impacted local neighbourhoods. I can only represent your views if you let me know what you think; then I can better bang the drum for our communities.

We should be hearing soon about the Stones Farm development. I feel the best we could do as a community was done – being able to play my part in that was great, helping to argue our corner for team Cricklade.

Lastly, in February we start to see flowers emerge and getting to see a bit more daylight. My hope is that we will soon be starting to plan for specific improvements locally and Wiltshire Council wants to promote more 'active travel' (walking and cycling). A cycling holiday in Holland (which used to have the worst traffic in Europe) was a joy, and something I hope we could work towards.

Many thanks for all the help you give me to fight our collective corner of Wiltshire. It's a privilege to try to help people, and if you think I could be helping you, please do get in touch and I'll see what I can do.

Tuesday 18 March (7.30pm at St Sampson's Church) **Minister Shermara Fletcher-Hoyte** is a millennial figure in Ecumenical, Pentecostal, and Charismatic relations. She serves as the Principal Officer at Churches Together in England and also has responsibility for racial justice and young adult ecumenical engagement. A dedicated minister and international speaker, Shermara is committed to fostering holistic and flourishing lives. Her

leadership was notably highlighted when she read before a global audience of 4.1 billion at Queen Elizabeth II's funeral on 19 September 2022. Shermara's expertise and passion has earned her spots on platforms like BBC Radio 2, BBC Radio 4, BBC World News, Talk TV, The God Channel, TBN, UBC Radio, and Premier Radio. Her accolades include the MAB International 2022 Young Leader of the Year Award, the 2020 Exceptional Young Woman Award from The Wise Women Awards, and the 2019 Community Recognized Project Award by the Queen's Lord Lieutenant, highlighting her significant impact within the community and homelessness sector.

Wednesday 19 March (7.30pm at St Sampson's Church) **Stuart Burgess** is Professor of Engineering Design at Bristol University and an adjunct professor at Liberty University, USA. He has led the design of the chain drive for the British Olympic Cycling Team for the last three Olympics and exhibited this work at the Royal Society. He has received many academic awards including: (i) the IMechE Clayton Prize 2019 (the top mechanical engineering prize in the UK); (ii) the



Turner's Gold Medal for spacecraft design; (iii) a Design Council Prize presented by the UK Minister of State for Trade and Industry; and (iv) the Wessex Scientific Medal for work on biomimetics. see https://profstuartburgess.com.



Thursday 10 April (7.30pm at St Sampson's Church) **Rt Hon John Glen MP** has been the Member of Parliament for Salisbury since 2010 and was elected to serve on the House of Commons Treasury Select Committee in October 2024 having been the Shadow Paymaster General for 4 months since the July 2024 General Election. John served in the cabinet of Rishi Sunak's administration as both Chief Secretary to the Treasury and Paymaster General in the Cabinet Office, during which

time he delivered the compensation scheme for the Infected Blood Scandal. Prior to these cabinet roles he spent a record tenure of four and a half years as Economic Secretary (City Minister) in HMT and was briefly Arts Minister and a Parliamentary Private Secretary to three cabinet Ministers including Lord Hammond when he was Chancellor. John was a strategy consultant at Accenture from 1997-2010. He was also a JP in Westminster for 6 years. John grew up in North Wiltshire and attended King Edward's School, Bath before reading Modern History at Mansfield College, Oxford (1993-1996) where he was JCR President. John studied for an MBA at Fitzwilliam College Cambridge in 2002-3. In 2014/15 John completed an MA in International Security and Strategy at King's College London whilst participating in the Royal College of Defence Studies (RCDS) Course for senior military leaders and civil servants.



Atlantic Rocketman – The World's Toughest Row '24

My name is Andrew Major. I grew up in Cricklade in the 70s and 80s attending St Sampson's Primary & Junior school, and my mother still lives in Cricklade.

On 11 December, I started an epic journey rowing solo 3,000 nautical miles across the Atlantic Ocean from La Gomera in the Canary Islands to Nelson's Dockyard, in Antigua & Barbuda in an ocean rowing boat just 7 metres long in an annual race called The World's Toughest Row.



The Atlantic Ocean is the second largest of the world's five oceans and covers 17% of the earth's surface with an average depth of 2,646 metres. I envisage it will take me 50-80 days to row across. More people have reached the summit of Everest or travelled into space than have successfully rowed an ocean.

Everyone who has embarked upon this epic voyage prior has chosen a charitable cause to champion. I am honoured and proud to be supporting the Elton John AIDS Foundation which provides meaningful and tangible support for LGBTQ+ communities. Together let's end LGBTQ+ stigma

My Ocean Rowing Boat is "Jazzy" and looks like a piece of art with the Pride ribbon wrapped around it. I will take everything I need to survive for a crossing lasting 60-90 days at sea including all my own food and water maker.

I will face 40 foot high waves, the relentless sun beating down on me and salt sores.

Each rowing boat taking part in the race will have a small device attached to it called a Yellow Brick Tracker. You can see my progress each day by downloading the free *Yellow Brick YB Races App* onto your phone or device.

Open the Race App and tap on the grey bar at the top called 'Add Races' – click here and add races to your feed. Search for the World's Toughest Row – Atlantic 2024 and click on this icon to access the map and leaderboard.
