#### **PARKING**

Please can we remind everyone that there is ample parking on the High Street for those lucky enough to be able bodied. Please allow the members of the public who are not so fortunate the five designated disabled spaces on the High Street. For those needing the disabled spaces, may we remind you of the necessity of putting your blue badge and clock in the window. This will help to prevent anger from other disabled badge users who may not be able to get into the spaces provided.

We would like to remind everyone, that parking on Double Yellows is not permitted unless continuously unloading, up to 40 minutes, allowing a passenger to alight or if you are Disabled, and showing your badge and clock, briefly. The lines are there for a reason, usually for the safety of others.

Parking on pavements is not permitted; it is often easier to protect your car by being on the path, as in Calcutt Street, however in other parts of the town, i.e. the estates, the path is for pedestrians and the car should not take precedence over pedestrians. Please bear this in mind when you park your vehicle.

#### **High Street and Other Improvements**

Painting of Cricklade High Street ironmongery including the bases of the lamp post and bollards is now completed ready for the summer season and, along with the annual



spring clean in conjunction with Keep Britain Tidy campaign, we are in a good position for the tourist season. Thank you to all those who moved vehicles and bikes to accommodate our grounds team, whilst painting was in operation, and to all the volunteers who helped to clear the green areas of debris.

There has been a programme of improvements to the town centre street furniture. The scheme includes repainting the heritage lamp posts, bollards, bins and cycle racks. Signage has been improved, including renewing the brown 'tourist' signs on the A419. We have been able to use funding made available under

the Wiltshire Council 'Towns Programme' which has made a valuable contribution.

## Wiltshire Perspective

#### **Flood Summit**

The first of March saw Cricklade hosting a flood summit, the purpose being to allow all interested parties:

- · to voice their concerns and, more specifically,
- to articulate what needs to be done to improve the Wiltshire side of the South Cotswolds constituency.

The meeting was well attended as it's an issue that's close to many of the hearts of this division as well as further afield. There were some common themes that stood out that we can focus on as a community and as a pressure group. The intention is now to take those actions and get all interested parties to:

- try to work together rather than blame one another
- to see what can be done to mitigate the increasing flooding and flood risks that we suffer from.

While Roz Savage, our MP must take the credit for this, I can take a little credit for hosting it here, allowing Cricklade, Latton & Marston Meysey's voice to be heard loud and clear. Thanks to all the residents who attended.

#### **Democracy**

April is the month of the new Financial Year and the last of this Council. After the Election on 1 May, a new Council is constituted and new appointments are made to the committees based on the Councillors that have been elected.

This may mean a range of things, from no change at all to a complete rethink based on a new set of priorities. The three Annual Meetings that I got invited to last year (Cricklade, Latton & Marston Meysey) were all non-political, and Royal Wootton Bassett is currently looking to follow suit. The benefit of this is that on the ground, political parties make very little difference in my opinion, as everyone wants to live healthy, safe and happy lives, and what needs doing is largely agreed on – the debate being more along the lines of in which order of priority things are tackled. At the county level, this prioritisation significantly influences many functional areas, and political values tend to have a more substantial impact.

On the subject of local democracy, I've been told there are some vacancies on Latton Parish Council. There are many benefits to standing on a local council, from playing a part in setting the local agenda to spreading the workload more thinly across people in your local community. And, if not you, then who else will be setting the agenda? To apply you might want to drop an email in the first instance to <code>clerk@latton-pc.gov.uk</code>.

#### **Budget Vote**

The finance debate in County Hall had few resolutions that were put to the vote. However the 820 page agenda was perhaps one of the most impenetrable reads I've had. I suspect few others in the chamber had fully understood the details of what they were voting on and it eventually got through unchanged.

Once again, it's a privilege to try to help people, and if you think I could be helping you, please do get in touch and I'll see what I can do.

Where possible, appointments will be held virtually. However, Roz is also hosting less frequent in-person surgeries at various locations across the constituency to ensure accessibility for all residents.






#### **Easter Raffle**

**Thursday 10 April** (7.30pm at St Sampson's School, Bath Road SN6 6AX) **Rt Hon John Glen MP** has been the Member of Parliament for Salisbury since 2010 and was elected to serve on the House of Commons Treasury Select Committee in October 2024 having been the Shadow Paymaster General for 4 months since the July 2024 General Election. John served in the cabinet of Rishi Sunak's administration as both Chief Secretary to the Treasury and Paymaster General in the Cabinet Office, during which time he delivered the compensation scheme for the Infected Blood Scandal.



Prior to these cabinet roles he spent a record tenure of four and a half years as Economic Secretary (City Minister) in HMT and was briefly Arts Minister and a Parliamentary Private Secretary to three cabinet Ministers including Lord Hammond when he was Chancellor. John was a strategy consultant at Accenture from 1997-2010. He was also a JP in Westminster for 6 years. John grew up in North Wiltshire and attended King Edward's School, Bath before reading Modern History at Mansfield College, Oxford (1993-1996) where he was JCR President. John studied for an MBA at Fitzwilliam College Cambridge in 2002-3.



**Friday 11 April** (7.30pm at St Sampson's School, Bath Road SN6 6AX) **Lisa Potts** first came to prominence when, as a nursery nurse in Wolverhampton, she protected her pupils from a machete-wielding attacker. Through her bravery she has won 19 awards including the highest civilian award the George Medal. Lisa, talks about how God carried her

through her difficult and terrifying experience, the subsequent rehabilitation through her terrible injuries and how she came to terms with her new found fame.

Neighbouring Guide units in Purton and South Cerney are full, meaning that Cricklade girls need to travel further afield to continue their guiding adventures after Brownies. And there are enough girls on the Rainbow waiting list to open another unit. Some on the waiting list are unlikely to get a Rainbow place.

We would love to open a Guide unit in Cricklade and we'd also love to open a second Rainbow unit, but we need **new adult volunteers** to make those wishes a reality.

#### Why volunteer?

- Hearing a Rainbow say to a new girl who doesn't know anyone, "I didn't know anybody when I started, but now everyone is my friend."
- Seeing the look of pride on a Brownie's face after she has conquered her fears to go on a climbing wall.
- Hearing a Guide tell others all about the fantastic experience she has had on an international camp.
- Hearing a teenage young leader say she wants to lead her own Brownie unit when she's older.

## The Final Word ...

One film that had been expected to do well in the Oscars (Academy Awards), was *Conclave*. It won awards and plaudits all round, Best Adaptation but not Best Picture! In its simplest form we can say the film is the adaptation of the book by Robert Harris which tells a story based on the election of a new Pope. Delving deeper we see inevitable arguments and alliances made, conservative/liberal; uneasy alliances, hidden back stories and manoeuvrings that would make an army proud.

It is an excellent film and one I recommend watching if you haven't already done so.

The overriding sense I got from the film was one of hope, hope in a process that has been unchanged for centuries, hope that differing beliefs and opinions can be held together for a greater good, hope that the will of God will be revealed at the right time.

We are approaching Easter. Christians do so having lived through Lent and that will mean different things to different people, a time of giving up or taking up, a time of going without or increased Bible study; a time of reflection before Holy Week and Easter Day itself.

One of the benefits of Lent is that it can include the component that we all wish for more of – time. If Lent is about reflection, then that can only happen when we stop and make the time and space to do just that. And that broad idea of reflection can be individual, all-inclusive, country-wide or global. We can use it to consider our relationship with God, what God may be saying to us, to the church, to those in the world who hold power.

We see many powerplays in Holy Week, it bounces back and forth, one moment it is with the people, then Rome and its army. Different religious factions get their say and at the centre of it is a man, in his thirties, a man called Jesus who was both the Son of God and the Son of Man. A man whose only 'crime' was to tell the people about the love of God, to give them hope and to tell those who held the power that it had to be used for the good of all, not the select few.

A message too far, so he was condemned to death.

But God's love overcame death, good overcame evil, hope triumphed over despair; so on Easter Day we can shout "Christ is Risen, Alleluia."

I wish you all a Happy and Blessed Easter.
