

Wiltshire Connect Bus

It has been announced that the Wiltshire Connect Bus will now encompass Cricklade in its network, using an App on your phone (Android or Apple) or by ringing 01225 7129002 to book a trip within the bounds of the 12-mile radius network which will enable access to the hospital in Malmesbury for example.

For those with concessionary bus passes, they work in the same way as the 51 or 53. For everyone else it is payable.

The bus is intended for reaching places our normal bus services

cannot reach, or that those with disabilities cannot use.

For those less abled to get to a bus stop, you can sign up to the app and see if they can collect from your doorstep. This will be appraised.

Wiltshire Perspective

Firstly and most importantly, I owe a big thanks to you for all the support and feedback for returning me to be your representative in County Hall in Trowbridge. Thanks also go to everyone who helped and supported me to facilitate that outcome; you are all amazing.

At the time of writing, the full detailed picture is unclear as to how Wiltshire Council will be run going forward. Some planning and thoughts took place before the election on the various possible outcomes. With no overall control, Council decisions will rely far more on a collaborative approach, which I think will be good for the county.

One main priority is to try to devolve the decision-making process down nearer to the people who are impacted, and to ensure the Council listens more now and for the future. That transition process will be the focus over the next few weeks.

Getting on with the main business, there are three issues that I would like to bring to our collective attention:

- Latton Parish Council
- Garden time and bonfires
- · Off-road bikes used on the road.

Latton Parish Council: nobody has come forward to stand for the Parish Council. We all care about where we live and we're happy to point out things we're unhappy about, so being on a Parish Council is a chance for each of us to influence how our communities develop. If not you, then who will be making those decisions on your behalf? Please get in touch if you would like to influence how Latton develops and becomes an even better place for you and your fellow residents.

Now summer has properly started (hopefully) with respect to spending time in the garden. This often includes bonfires and barbeques. Please be mindful and considerate to your neighbours. It only takes a few unthinking moments to ruin a neighbour's social event or time outside, but you'll be living next to each other for very much longer. So it pays to be thoughtful and be a good neighbour. It will make your own life easier in the long run. Please let them know your intentions in advance and I would urge you bring the subject up courteously before things go too far off the rails. Wiltshire Council doesn't proscribe or endorse any time periods for or against activities, because we all have different life patterns and times when we can enjoy the company of those we love outdoors.

Also, Wiltshire Police have been in touch with me with regards to ongoing investigations. Specifically with people using unregistered off-road motorbikes on our streets. They're asking for reports of sightings, including the place, the date and the time of each occasion you spot the person. Please report this to the police on 101 or report online at www.wiltshire.police.uk, using the Crime tab. It all helps bring together a picture and pattern of behaviour that can be used in conducting targeted patrols to capture the offenders in the act.

Many thanks again, it's a privilege to try to help people, and if you think I can help you, please do get in touch and I'll see what I can do.


The Amethyst Incident

Last month, I didn't have room to finish my father's war story, but there's a space here

and you might find it interesting!

While in Malta (1946) Ken Dixon had entered the Civil Service exams for the Foreign Office. He passed the first written exam in Cairo. Back in Malta he was ordered to London to sit more exams, including a language examination, a weekend group session and interviews at a college in southern England for a week. Results would take ages.

He was demobbed in 1946 and returned



The job with the Foreign Office would have been a Vice Consulship in Nanking, China, during their civil war. The candidate who got the posting had to be evacuated by HMS Amethyst, which was fired on by Chinese cliff batteries "and the poor chap was very badly injured," Dad added. By not getting the job Dad had a lucky escape!

Historical note:

The Nanking (Nanjing) British consulate came under siege by communist forces in April 1949 and the HMS Amethyst flotilla was sent to resupply the staff. On their journey up the Yangtze river, the flotilla came under heavy bombardment by the communist battery. Of the four ships in the Amethyst Incident (also known as the Yangtze Incident, 20 April 1949) Lieutenant Commander Skinner on HMS Amethyst was killed plus another 21 killed and 31 wounded. In the other ships of the flotilla, HMS Consort, HMS London and HMS Black Swan, a further 25 were killed and 43 wounded.
