#### **Important Travel Information**

#### A - An improved bus service - Wiltshire Connect

This has been mentioned before, but if we do not make use of the service, it might not be viable to keep going. The Wiltshire Connect Bus, is a booking service for those wishing to get around the local area but to places that are not on a direct bus route from Cricklade, i.e. Malmesbury, Royal Wootton Bassett, Kemble etc. There is a map on the leaflet, which can be collected from the Town Council Offices. You can use your existing bus pass or pay as you would on a bus, and it is open to all. It can pick you up at your door if you have a disablement and is available for hospital runs, however it will not wait for you like the LINK.

It runs weekdays 6am to 8pm and Saturdays 8am to 7.30pm. No service on Sunday. All services subject to availability of the vehicle. For more information:-Wiltshireconnect@wiltshire.gov.uk or call 01225 712900.

#### B - Improved bus timetable for the Stagecoach 53 service

This now runs on a Sunday! We have had a lot of interest in these leaflets; if you want an up-to-date version either check the stagecoach website or pop into the Council for a copy. [I have placed a copy of the timetable on pages 26 and 27. Ed.]

We understand from Stagecoach that Swindon Bus Station is due to close to all operations on 30 August 2025, with all Stagecoach services arriving and departing at a new site on Fleming Way from the following day.

## Wiltshire Perspective

- Thames Water
- Neighbourhood Plan
- Search and Rescue

Our recent hot dry summer reminded me of the summer of 1976, being followed by the rainiest October on record, with the annual rainfall for that year being average. If something similar happens again we're in for

a wet autumn! I don't know if we'll still have a hosepipe ban in place as you read this, but as at the end of July only 12 of the Environment Agency's 105 monitoring stations on the Thames were reporting 'Low' river levels [1]. The last reported figure I heard of the company's leakage rate was 42% [2]. In July, a Cricklade resident pointed out a leak to me and I was able to help get that prioritised and fixed quickly. If you want to report a leak yourself, please contact them on 0800 714 614 (option 1). From Wiltshire Council's perspective, Thames Water only accounts for roughly 14% of residents, compared to 82% that are with Wessex Water, but it's obviously 100% of Cricklade and Latton.

Wiltshire has around 260 Towns and Parishes. It's not easy to find out how many of them have a neighbourhood plan. Cricklade is one that does, and it's currently being refreshed, thanks to the work of Cricklade's Town Council Chair and a working party. With so many developments in and around our town and parishes it may not seem obvious what point it serves. However, there are two main benefits to us:

- 1) Having a Neighbourhood Plan means Cricklade receives 25% of the Community Infrastructure Levy (a charge per m² raised by Wiltshire Council on any new development) rather than 15%. That means we have significantly more funds available to put into local projects and improvements.
- 2) It also means that Wiltshire Council's planning department can (and does) refer to it when pushing back on some proposed developments. By default, planning permission will be decided by the planning officer, however I can ask for it to be referred to local Wiltshire Councillors to decide by exception. We have exercised this 'calling in' process three times for Cricklade Town Council and once for Latton (which doesn't have a neighbourhood plan) to lobby for our preferred outcome for applications. Where we have been able to refer to the Neighbourhood Plan, we've been fortunate enough to be successful each time.

Lastly, towards the end of September, Cricklade will be hosting an exercise for Wiltshire's Search and Rescue teams. These are volunteers who go out searching for someone who might be missing or vulnerable. I hope it'll be an opportunity for us to see what they do and perhaps help and support their work.

Many thanks again, especially to those who have reached out to me. If you think I can help you, please do get in touch (feel free to chase me) and I'll do my best.

Entrance is free but in order to manage the numbers, you need to pick up a ticket from the receptionists at Purton or Cricklade surgery. The tickets are available from 1 September.


#### 200 Club:





# The Final Word ...

In the beginning was the word, and the word was green (with apologies to St John).

Harvest is upon us, a time when we thank God for creation and the gifts it brings. As we think about how we and God relate to creation, there are some ideas we might ponder. At the beginning of the Bible, in the book of Genesis, are two stories that help us to flesh out some of our ideas.

The first of these stories is written like an act of worship, with the repeated refrain 'God saw that it was good' – the whole of creation is seen to have a high worth in God's eyes, and for us 'all creation is a song of praise to God', as Hildegard of Bingen put it.

Humanity is given a special responsibility in the order of creation. To use the biblical language from the story, we are to 'subdue' and 'have dominion' over it. Nowadays these words attract many negative connotations, but actually it's much more about 'to bring order and well-being', and to 'care for their well-being'. The second of the creation stories in Genesis echoes this as well; humanity was placed into the garden to 'till and care for' the soil.

To me it is absolutely clear that both in response to God's goodness to us, and as people who want to let others know of it, that all of creation can be thought of as 'God's first cathedral' – a place where God can be found, sensed, and worshipped. Should we choose to spoil creation by abandoning our responsibility to care for it, then it is akin to placing a barrier between people and their awareness of God's presence. As the psalmist wrote: "The heavens tell out the glory of the Lord, they make known his handywork". (Ps 19:1).

Let us indeed celebrate creation in this harvest season and do our best to ensure the well being of all God's wonderful creation.
