Remembrance Services

The Remembrance Sunday Parade on 9 November will muster at Waylands and march down the High Street to the War Memorial, where the Act of Remembrance and a short service will take place. The parade will then march back up the High Street via Bath Road to St Sampson's Church.

On Tuesday 11 November at 11am there will be a short closure of the area around the War Memorial to enable the local schools to attend a brief service of remembrance.

There will be road closures in place on both days to ensure the safety of participants. The Council apologises for any inconvenience these events may cause residents but at no time will emergency services be hindered.

Youth Provision. The Rise Trust run a Safe Space on Tuesday in the Youth Building at Cricklade Leisure Centre from 7.30 to 8.30pm for year 8 and above. Not sure what to expect? A safe space to chill, get outreach support from youth workers, snacks and activities and meet new friends.

Skateboard event. In August ATBshop came to Cricklade and ran two free scootering and skateboarding sessions for the young people of Cricklade. There were over 40 young people from age 5 upwards at the events. The events were funded by the FUEL programme at Wiltshire Council. A great time was had by all.



Cricklade Town Council has paid for another session to be run by ATB and that will take place at the skatepark on Wednesday 29 October 2025 from 10am to 1pm. Open to young people aged from 5.

Wiltshire Perspective

Two topics this month:

Council Plan
 Active Travel

Council Plan: In February Wiltshire Council approved a Business Plan. Since the election, the Council has since drawn up a different approach called a Council Plan, setting out the strategic priorities that the Council wants to focus on. This was taken around several locations

in the county and feedback was and is being taken on board. It's not the usual door stopper document, only about half a dozen pages. You can find it by going to *tinyurl.com/whswzny7*, or by searching Wiltshire Council plan 2025-2035, or this QR code (*right*).



There was general agreement from all parties that it helped clarify the scope of what any council can do and to try to set expectations of what is possible after multiple decades of drift away from council control. One example is social housing, where the Council used to be the landlord, but which is now in the hands of private companies. Wiltshire Council can however still exert pressure on them, and our ability has been demonstrated a few times by my work here in our division.

Active Travel: This means cycling and walking and is something Wiltshire Council has been promoting for some time. The two main factors are limiting traffic growth and the obvious health advantages for both individuals and the environment.

The Council's process is to draw up detailed plans for the larger towns and fund the infrastructure later. Our local communities were left off the list, but it doesn't mean we can't move forward on our own, at least for the 'planning-what-we-want' phase.

Royal Wootton Bassett drew up detailed plans to have a cycleway to Swindon, which took many years and it had a projected budget of £5m. The price was too high and the whole project was put on ice. I've no idea how that figure broke down or what proportion was going to be funded by Swindon Borough Council, but I'm not surprised at the outcome for that price.

Hopefully a less ambitious approach might have more success and I would like Cricklade and Latton to think about what we want so we can help our own communities.

It's all very well me thinking up ideas, but it's all of us collectively that need to ensure that what we aim for will squeeze the most benefit for as many of us as possible. With that in mind I would like to reach out to as wide a range of residents as possible to gather thoughts for what best looks like, so we get the optimal outcome for us.

If you have thoughts, or would like to critique ideas, I hope to set up a site by the time of publication. The site will be *crickladelattonactive.com*

I'm aware that not everyone has access to the internet. If you don't or resent always being pushed in that direction, I apologise, and if you can't get to the library I will try to ensure printed copies are available if you contact me.

If you think I can help you with this or anything else, please do get in touch and I promise to do my best.





The Final Word ...

On my daily walks or runs around the town, I often pass the community orchard in Fairview Fields. Over the past couple of years, it's been a delight to watch it develop from small, straggly saplings to the point of seeing real apples and pears. The trees are still very young but even during the difficult dry spring and summer this year, their roots have been robust enough for them to continue to grow and, quite literally, bear fruit.

In Psalm 1, the writer talks of the faithful as those who are "like trees planted by streams of water, that yield fruit in due season, and their leaves flourish; and in all they do they give life".

Like many people, I look at the world around us often with a heavy heart. Amid wars, acts of unconscionable cruelty and disregard for others' humanity, and inaction in the face of climate crisis, it can be all too easy to fall into despair and think "what can I do in the face of all this?"

While I can't change the world, I have increasingly become aware of the connection between my own words, actions and responses, and the "big issues". I can choose not to add to the violence and hate of the world by careful choices in what I do or how I speak of others. Even if the soil of public discourse feels increasingly dry and parched, each of us can choose to do what we can to bear good fruit; to root ourselves in love and wisdom and to strive that in "all we do we give life".
